+ **COMMEMORATION:** THELMA STEVENS

""Let's call this meeting to order," Thelma Stevens would say. Long after a stroke deprived her of clear thinking, Stevens carried on habits developed during a lifetime devoted to serving God. Stevens (b. 1902) worked to overcome barriers that divide and separate people.

Propelled by the memory of witnessing a Mississippi lynching, Stevens made a commitment to spend her life working to eradicate racism. She studied New Testament and sociology at Scarritt College. She learned that Jesus rejected the external authority of Jewish tradition in favor of an inner moral consciousness guided by "his sense of the presence and spirit of God." [xliii] Stevens rejected teachings of church and culture about the sanctity of segregation, replacing them with a

belief, confirmed by her experiences in black communities of Nashville and Augusta, that all persons are children of God who deserve to be treated with equality, dignity, and respect.

For 28 years from 1940 to 1968, Stevens headed the Department of Christian Social Relations of the Women's Division of the Board of Missions of The Methodist Church. Because the gospel of Jesus taught racial inclusiveness, Stevens called Methodist women to work to end discrimination in the military, schools, government, business, and in The Methodist Church.

Guided by multiracial consultations, Stevens outlined for Methodist women appropriate next steps for dismantling racism. Women of the Woman's Society of Christian Service and the Wesleyan Service Guild laced their meetings with Bible study and prayer. They adopted a Charter on Racial Policies. Community surveys and local discussions uncovered problems and pain. International, interracial teams of women toured the U.S., leading workshops on racism. In times of racial crisis, Stevens initiated seminars on race that brought community leaders to deal with heated passions, anger, inequity, and rumor. Quietly and often surreptitiously, Methodist

women carried on interracial work in local communities all over the nation."
