+ WORD: Acts 11:19-26 CEB

¹⁹ Now those who were scattered as a result of the trouble that occurred because of Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Antioch. They proclaimed the word only to Jews. ²⁰ Among them were some people from Cyprus and Cyrene. They entered Antioch and began to proclaim the good news about the Lord Jesus also to Gentiles. ²¹ The Lord's power was with them, and a large number came to believe and turned to the Lord.

²² When the church in Jerusalem heard about this, they sent Barnabas to Antioch. ²³ When he arrived and saw evidence of God's grace, he was overjoyed and encouraged everyone to remain fully committed to the Lord. ²⁴ Barnabas responded in this way because he was a good man, whom the Holy Spirit had endowed with exceptional faith. A considerable number of people were added to the Lord. ²⁵ Barnabas went to Tarsus in search of Saul. ²⁶ When he found him, he brought him to Antioch. They were there for a whole year, meeting with the church and teaching large numbers of people. It was in Antioch where the disciples were first labeled "Christians."

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

This is what your holy <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate *us*; mercy a-mong our *ancestors*, and remembrance of your <u>ho</u>-ly *covenant*.

+ COMMEMORATION: JOHN OF DAMASCUS

John was the son of a Christian tax collector for the Caliph of Damascus. Because of his position, John's father was able to obtain the services of a learned Christian monk to tutor his son. John proved to be an able student and impressed the Caliph with his knowledge and abilities. The faith of the monk, and of his parents, became a vital part of John's life also.

As a young man, John followed in his father's footsteps and served in the high office of the Caliph's government. While serving in that position he wrote the first of three discussions of the veneration of icons, favoring their use. This work involved him in the iconoclast controversy raging throughout Christianity. During the course of these early writings, around 730, John was ordained a priest.

Shortly after these publications John entered a monastery at Mar Saba, near Jerusalem. He devoted himself to study,

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preaching, and writing for the rest of his life. His greatest work, *The Fountain Of Knowledge*, had a great impact on the theology of both the Eastern and Western Churches.

John was also a poet and hymn writer. Two of his hymns that are still sung today are "The Day of Resurrection, Earth Tell It Out Abroad" and "Come Ye Faithful, Raise the Strain." Many more are used in the eastern Orthodox Church.
