+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

+ COMMEMORATION: JOHN STEWART

"Born of free blacks in 1786, John Stewart remained in his native state of Virginia until the age of twenty-one. When he left home to move to Ohio, Stewart began his long and difficult personal journey through a spiritual wilderness. Robbed of all his possessions, dependent on alcohol, and alternately dissolute and remorseful, he finally became so despondent that he wanted to end his life. As he contemplated death he thought he heard a voice call his name. He saw no one, but was able to turn back and begin his process of conversation.

Stewart attended nearby Methodist camp and prayer meetings, and entered a period of deep reflection. While in private prayer, he again thought he heard a voice, this time directing him to "declare my counsel faithfully." For a time, he struggled against the call and finally fell ill.

Confronting death once again, he vowed to commit himself to mission work among the Indians, and to follow his calling to the northwest.

With neither money nor credentials, Stewart began work among the Wyandot Indians of Ohio in the winter of 1816. Faced with strong resistance by the Wyandots, envious accusations by other Christians, and recurring charges by dishonest whites that he was a runaway slave, Stewart persevered with courage and determination. The Quarterly Conference licensed the "missionary pioneer" in 1818, and the following year, the Ohio Conference established an official mission to the Wyandots. By the time he died in 1823, Stewart had converted numerous Wyandots and had been adopted into their nation."
