Antiphon:

We shall listen Lord, to your teaching, And heed the words of your mouth.

- ¹ Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth.
- ² I will open my mouth in a <u>pa-ra-ble</u>; I will utter dark sayings <u>from</u> of <u>old</u>,
- ³ things that we have <u>heard</u> and *known*, that our ancestors have told *us*.
- ⁴We will not hide them <u>from</u> their children; we will tell to the coming <u>gen</u>-er-ation the glorious deeds of the LORD, <u>and</u> his *might*, and the wonders that <u>he</u> has *done*.

We shall listen Lord, to your teaching, And heed the words of your mouth. ⁵ He established a de-cree in Jacob, and appointed a <u>law</u> in *IsraeI*,
which he commanded our ancestors to teach <u>to</u> their children;
⁶ that the next generation <u>might</u> know them, the children yet unborn, and rise up and tell them <u>to</u> their children,
⁷ so that they should set their <u>hope</u> in *God*, and not forget the works of God, but keep <u>his</u> com-mandments;
⁸ and that they should not be <u>like</u> their ancestors, a stubborn and rebellious <u>gen</u>-er-ation,
a generation whose heart was <u>not</u> stead-fast, whose spirit was not faith-<u>ful</u> to *God*.

- ¹⁷ Yet they sinned still more <u>a</u>-gainst *him*, rebelling against the Most High <u>in</u> the *desert*.
- 18 They tested God in their heart by demanding the food they craved.
- ¹⁹ They spoke a-gainst God, saying,
 "Can God spread a table in the wil-der-ness?
- ²⁰ Even though he struck the rock so that water gushed out

and torrents <u>o</u>-ver-flowed, can he also give bread, or provide meat <u>for</u> his people?"

We shall listen Lord, to your teaching, And heed the words of your mouth.

- ²¹ Therefore, when the Lord heard, he was <u>full</u> of *rage*; a fire was kindled against Jacob, his anger mounted <u>a</u>-gainst *Israel*,
- ²² because they had no <u>faith</u> in *God*, and did not trust his sav-ing *power*.
- ²³ Yet he commanded the <u>skies</u> a-bove, and opened the <u>doors</u> of *heaven*;
- ²⁴ he rained down on them manna to eat, and gave them the grain of heaven.
- ²⁵ Mortals ate of the <u>bread of angels</u>; he sent them food <u>in abun-dance</u>.
- ²⁶ He caused the east wind to blow <u>in</u> the *heavens*, and by his power he led out <u>the</u> south *wind*;
- ²⁷ he rained flesh upon them like *dust*, winged birds like the sand of the *seas*;
- ²⁸ he let them fall with-<u>in</u> their *camp*, all a-<u>round</u> their *dwellings*.
- ²⁹ And they ate and were well filled, for he gave them what they craved.

 ³³ His disciples replied, "Where are we going to get enough food in this wilderness to satisfy such a big crowd?"
- ³⁴ Jesus said, "How much bread do you have?"
 They responded, "Seven loaves and a few fish."
