⁵ In the days of King Herod of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly order of Abijah. His wife was a descendant of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. ⁶ Both of them were righteous before

God, living blamelessly according to all the commandments and regulations of the Lord. ⁷ But they had no children, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were getting on in years.

⁸ Once when he was serving as priest before God and his section was on duty, 9 he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to enter the sanctuary of the Lord and offer incense. ¹⁰ Now at the time of the incense offering, the whole assembly of the people was praying outside. ¹¹ Then there appeared to him an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. ¹² When Zechariah saw him, he was terrified; and fear overwhelmed him. ¹³ But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you will name him John. ¹⁴ You will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, ¹⁵ for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He must never drink wine or strong drink; even before his birth he will be filled with the Holy Spirit. ¹⁶ He will turn many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. ¹⁷ With the spirit and power of Elijah he will go before him, to turn the hearts of parents to their children, and the

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

+ COMMEMORATION: WESLEY BRANCH RICKEY

Not all saints serve Christ as monastics or clergy. Wesley Branch Rickey reminds us of the power all Christians share to change the world if they live out the gospel in their own situations. He was born in Ohio on December 20, 1881 to parents who named him after the founder of their Methodist faith. From the beginning, Rickey's life combined a deeply religious nature, a searching intellect,

and a passionate love of baseball.

To support himself during his legal studies at Ohio Wesleyan, Rickey coached the school's baseball team. Once while traveling, the team stopped in a hotel for the evening where the hotel staff would not let Rickey's star player, an African American catcher named Charlie Thomas, register for a room. Rickey invited Thomas to share his room. The effect of the country's pervasive racism haunted Rickey until he made his contribution to civil rights.

That contribution came years later when Rickey was general manager of the Brooklyn Dodgers. There, he began to search for an African-American athlete with whom he could begin integration of the white baseball world.

By 1945 Rickey had chosen Jack Robinson,
a talented Negro League player whose baseball skills
were matched by his desire for justice and immense inner
strength. Together, Rickey and Robinson partnered to
bring equality to baseball players regardless of their skin
color. Although Robinson bore the brunt of the ugly
attacks on integrated baseball, the two men and their
families supported one another during their struggle for
equal rights.
