+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

This is what your holy <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate *us*; mercy a-mong our *ancestors*,

and remembrance of your <u>ho</u>-ly covenant.

This is the promise you swore to our <u>an</u>-cestor, *Abraham*,

to make us <u>un</u>-a-fraid,

+ COMMEMORATION: Jacob Arminius

Jacob Arminius, was a Dutch pastor and theologian, born in 1559. He spent most of his pastorate in the city of Amsterdam where he opposed the predestination position of Calvinism, even as it became the official state religion. To Arminius, *predestination* meant that all who accept Christ are predestined to be saved by God, but it is the choice of the individual to accept or reject God in the life of Christ. Many of the teachings of Arminius were embraced by John Wesley and are a part of the Methodist tradition.

Almighty God, you gave to your servant Jacob Arminius special gifts of grace to understand and teach the truth as it is in Christ Jesus: Grant that by this teaching we may know you, the one true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**
