# + CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

#### + COMMEMORATION: ELIZA GARRETT

At 20 years of age, Eliza Clark married Augustus Garrett and they lived in Chicago as it grew from frontier outpost

into a town. Eliza was an active member of the Clark Street Methodist Episcopal Church. Augustus, who died in 1848, appeared frequently to fall from grace being converted 20 times. Eliza Clarke inherited half of her husband's estate and began to think how best to use it for the good of the church. The pastor of Clark Street Church Struggled with his lack of formal education and this helped awaken Eliza to see the educational needs of Methodist clergy. At that time, a group was already planning Northwestern University and an active vision grew to found a biblical institute for Methodist clergy.

With help, Garrett's vision was petitioned at the 1854
General Conference. Although Methodists were reluctant to have educated clergy, the considerable size of her gift could not be turned away. So Eliza Garrett is credited with "turning the whole Church into this new career of ministerial improvement."
