Listen to the sound of my cry, my King <u>and</u> my God, for to <u>you</u> I pray.

- ¹ Give ear to my <u>words</u>, O *LORD*; give heed <u>to</u> my *sighing*.
- ² Listen to the sound <u>of</u> my *cry*, my King and my God, for to <u>you</u> I *pray*.
- ³ O LORD, in the morning you <u>hear</u> my *voice*; in the morning I plead my case to <u>you</u>, and *watch*.
- ⁴ For you are not a God who delights in <u>wick</u>-ed-*ness*; evil will not so-journ with *you*.
- ⁵ The boastful will not stand be-<u>fore</u> your *eyes*; you hate all <u>e</u>-vil-*doers*.
- ⁶ You destroy those <u>who</u> speak *lies*; the LORD abhors the bloodthirsty <u>and</u> de-*ceitful*.
- ⁷ But I, through the abundance of your <u>stead</u>-fast <u>love</u>, will <u>enter</u> your *house*,
- I will bow down toward your <u>ho</u>-ly *temple* in <u>awe</u> of *you*.
- ⁸ Lead me, O LORD, in your righteousness

because of my enemies; make your way straight be-fore me. ⁹ For there is no truth in their *mouths*; their hearts are *destruction*; their throats are o-pen graves; they flatter with their tongues. ¹⁰ Make them bear their guilt, O God; let them fall by their own counsels; because of their many transgressions cast them out, for they have rebelled against you. ¹¹ But let all who take refuge in you rejoice; let them ever sing for joy. Spread your protection over them, so that those who love your name may ex-ult in you. ¹² For you bless the right-eous, O LORD; you cover them with favor as with a *shield*. Glory to you, O Trinity, most holy and blessed, one God, now and for-ever, A-men. Listen to the sound of my cry, my King and my God, for to you I pray.

+ SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

+ WORD: Acts 13:1-12 CEV

13 The church at Antioch had several prophets and teachers. They were Barnabas, Simeon, also called Niger, Lucius from Cyrene, Manaen, who was Herod's close friend, and Saul. ² While they were worshiping the Lord and going without eating, the Holy Spirit told them, "Appoint Barnabas and Saul to do the work for which I have chosen them." ³ Everyone prayed and went without eating for a while longer. Next, they placed their hands on Barnabas and Saul to show that they had been appointed to do this work. Then everyone sent them on their way.

⁴ After Barnabas and Saul had been sent by the Holy Spirit, they went to Seleucia. From there they sailed to the island of Cyprus. ⁵ They arrived at Salamis and began to preach God's message in the Jewish meeting places. They also had John^[G] as a helper.

⁶ Barnabas and Saul went all the way to the city of Paphos on the other end of the island, where they met a Jewish man named Bar-Jesus. He practiced witchcraft and was a false prophet. ⁷ He also worked for Sergius Paulus, who was very smart and was the governor of the island. Sergius Paulus wanted to hear God's message, and he sent for Barnabas and Saul. ⁸ But Bar-Jesus, whose other name was Elymas, was against them. He even tried to keep the governor from having faith in the Lord.

⁹ Then Saul, better known as Paul, was filled with the Holy Spirit. He looked straight at Elymas ¹⁰ and said, "You son of the devil! You are a liar, a crook, and an enemy of everything that is right. When will you stop speaking against the true ways of the Lord? ¹¹ The Lord is going to punish you by making you completely blind for a while."

Suddenly the man's eyes were covered by a dark mist, and he went around trying to get someone to lead him by the hand. ¹² When the governor saw what had happened, he was amazed at this teaching about the Lord. So he put his faith in the Lord.

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

This is what your holy <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate *us*;

mercy a-mong our ancestors,

and remembrance of your ho-ly covenant.

This is the promise you swore to our <u>an</u>-cestor, *Abraham*, to make us <u>un</u>-a-*fraid*,

+ COMMEMORATION: Richard Hooker

Richard Hooker lived during the reformation of the English Church – leaving Catholicism and determining what "church" meant if not filled with Catholic traditions and liturgy. As a leading English theologian in the late 1500s, he was able to offer a 'middle ground' between the old traditions and those demanded by the Puritans who felt if it was not in the Scriptures, it was not in church. Hooker's effect on Methodism can be found in his middle way as it included tradition from the past and scriptural authority – but with reason and understanding.

A quote from his writing translated into modern English says: "If you can't take the intellectual heat, get out of the kitchen. If you can't stand a book that makes you think, go read the funny papers."
