+ WORD: Galatians 1:11-24 CEV

¹¹ My friends, I want you to know that no one made up the message I preach. ¹² It wasn't given or taught to me by some mere human. My message came directly from Jesus Christ when he appeared to me.

¹³ You know how I used to live as a Jew. I was cruel to God's church and even tried to destroy it. ¹⁴ I was a much better Jew than anyone else my own age, and I obeyed every law that our ancestors had given us. ¹⁵ But even before I was born, God had chosen me. He was kind and had decided ¹⁶ to show me his Son, so that I would announce his message to the Gentiles. I didn't talk this over with anyone. ¹⁷ I didn't say a word, not even to the men in Jerusalem who were apostles before I was. Instead, I went at once to Arabia, and afterwards I returned to Damascus.

¹⁸ Three years later I went to visit Peter in Jerusalem and stayed with him for fifteen days. ¹⁹ The only other apostle I saw was James, the Lord's brother. ²⁰ And in the presence of God I swear I am telling the truth.

²¹ Later, I went to the regions of Syria and Cilicia. ²² But no one who belonged to Christ's churches in Judea had ever seen me in person. ²³ They had only heard that the one who had been cruel to them was now preaching the message that he had once tried to destroy. ²⁴ And because of me, they praised God.

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, God of Israel, for you come to visit us and ransom us from *bondage*. You have brought forth a strong De-liverer in the house of your child David. This is what your holy prophets an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate us; mercy a-mong our ancestors, and remembrance of your ho-ly covenant. + THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. From there he shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

+ COMMEMORATION: The Conversion of Paul

The conversion of Paul, the "Apostle of the Gentiles," took place within a few years following the crucifixion of Jesus, when he was still known as "Saul," a Jew of the tribe of Benjamin, a Pharisee, and a fervent opponent of the movement known as "the Way." According to the Acts of the Apostles, Paul approved of the stoning of Stephen. Following Stephen's martyrdom, Paul embarked upon a journey to Damascus to arrest some Christians there and bring them to Jerusalem for condemnation. It was on the road to Damascus that Paul was suddenly encountered by the risen Christ. This conversion experience is related three times in Acts (9: 1-19; 22: 5-16, and 26: 12-18). Although each of these accounts is narrated in a slightly different manner, the same basic sequence of events is consistently reported: Paul sees a great light and hears a voice saying,

"Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" Upon asking, "Who are you, Lord?", he hears the reply, "I am Jesus whom you are persecuting." With that, Paul is directed by the risen Lord to continue on his journey. Now, rather than arresting followers of "the Way," he begins his ministry of proclaiming the Gospel.

Paul himself recounts his conversion in Galatians recalling his "earlier life in Judaism" wherein he took to "violently persecuting the church of God" (1: 13). He emphasizes that God "called me through his grace," and "was pleased to reveal his Son to me, so that I might proclaim him among the Gentiles" (1: 15, 16). Thus Paul refers to himself as an "apostle," as he "was sent neither by human commission nor from human authorities, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead" (1: 1).

Paul's missionary activity contributed to the rapid growth of Gentile Christianity from Asia Minor westward. His letters have been formative for Christian theology and practice and his life bears witness to the transformative power of the gospel. A former enemy of the gospel, Paul himself was martyred under the Emperor Nero. It is this saint who, knowing the love of God which called him out of enmity into grace, wrote:

Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are all accounted sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loves us (Rom 8: 35-37).
