+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, God of Israel,

for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

This is what your holy prophets an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of all who hate us; mercy a-mong our ancestors, and remembrance of your ho-ly covenant. + THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ. his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. From there he shall come again to judge the living and the dead. + COMMEMORATION: JOHN RALEIGH MOTT (tr 1/31)

Lay evangelist, ecumenist, and president of the World Council of Churches, Mott was the most important Methodist ecumenist of the early twentieth century. Born in 1865 in Purvis, New York, his family soon moved west to Pottsville, Iowa, where he was raised until he returned to upstate New York to attend college at Cornell University. During his sophomore year, Mott felt a call to ministry and became involved in the Cornell University Christian Association, the YMCA, and the Student Volunteer Movement. His participation in these organizations planted in him his long interest in ecumenical cooperation.

The coming of World War I divided the nations among which Mott was working. Even so he did not give up in despair but set at once about saving the fragments." After the war, he continued his ecumenical efforts, traveling the world as an ambassador for peace, ecumenism, and Christian unity. These efforts culminated in the formation of the World Council of Churches in 1948. Mott was credited for his direct influence upon ten generations of students, from which the World Council's early leadership was largely drawn. In 1946 he was awarded the Nobel

Peace Prize. On this occasion he summarized his life as "an earnest and undiscourageable effort to weave together all nations, all races and all religious communions in friendliness, in fellowship and in cooperation." Shortly before his death, Mott reaffirmed a statement he made in 1933: "While life lasts I am an evangelist."
