# + SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

### + WORD: Acts 5:33-42 CEV

<sup>33</sup> When the council members heard this, they became so angry that they wanted to kill the apostles. <sup>34</sup> But one of the members was the Pharisee Gamaliel, a highly respected teacher. He ordered the apostles to be taken out of the room for a little while. <sup>35</sup> Then he said to the council:

People of Israel, be careful what you do with these men. <sup>36</sup> Not long ago Theudas claimed to be someone important, and about four hundred men joined him. But he was killed. All his followers were scattered, and that was the end of that.

<sup>37</sup>Later, when the people of our nation were being counted, Judas from Galilee showed up. A lot of people

followed him, but he was killed, and all his followers were scattered.

<sup>38</sup> So I advise you to stay away from these men. Leave them alone. If what they are planning is something of their own doing, it will fail. <sup>39</sup> But if God is behind it, you cannot stop it anyway, unless you want to fight against God.

The council members agreed with what he said, <sup>40</sup> and they called the apostles back in. They had them beaten with a whip and warned them not to speak in the name of Jesus. Then they let them go.

<sup>41</sup> The apostles left the council and were happy, because God had considered them worthy to suffer for the sake of Jesus. <sup>42</sup> Every day they spent time in the temple and in one home after another. They never stopped teaching and telling the good news that Jesus is the Messiah.

#### + CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

This is what your holy <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate *us*; mercy a-<u>mong</u> our *ancestors*, and remembrance of your <u>ho</u>-ly *covenant*. This is the promise you swore to our <u>an</u>-cestor, *Abraham*, to make us <u>un</u>-a-*fraid*, to rescue us <u>from</u> our *enemies*, to serve before you, holy and just,

all the days <u>of our lives</u>. And this, my little child, shall be called prophet of <u>the</u> Most *High*, going before you, Adonai, to pre-<u>pare</u> your *paths*, making your people <u>know</u> de-*liverance* by the forgiveness <u>of</u> their *sins*. Through your merciful compassions, <u>God</u> our *God*, the dawn from on high shall *visit us*, to shine on those kept in dungeons and the <u>shadows</u> of *death* and to guide our feet onto the <u>path</u> of *peace*. #### + THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. From there he shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

# + COMMEMORATION: TIMOTHY and TITUS

Timothy and Titus provided spiritual and intellectual support for the southern European mission of the Gospel. Communications preserved in the Pastoral Epistles, Paul's Letters, and the Church's story in Acts give us a glimpse into their contributions to the early Church.

The early Christian community at Lystra commended Eunice's son, Timothy, to Christian service with Paul. Young Timothy underwent circumcision in deference to his Jewish mother and the Jewish communities in which he would minister (Acts 16: 3). Undergoing ordination by laying on of hands (1 Tim 1: 18; 4: 17; 2 Tim 1: 6), he joined Paul for his second and third missionary journeys. As Paul's associate, Timothy's work was crucial in founding churches in Corinth, Thessalonica, and Philippi. He was sometimes sent to deal with

particularly sensitive and difficult situations. As Paul commends him to the Philippians, "I have no one like him who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. . . . Timothy's worth you know, how like a son with a father he has served with me in the work of the gospel" (Phil 2: 20, 22). He was appointed by Paul to be the bishop of the church in Ephesus (1 Tim 1: 3). Tradition holds that Timothy was martyred in Ephesus by stoning and clubbing under Emperor Nerva after Timothy's objections to the orgiastic worship of Artemis.

As circumcision figured in Timothy's nascent ministry, so it did with Titus as well. The decision that Titus would not undergo circumcision proved a major departure of Christianity from its Jewish roots (Gal 2: 1-3). Titus' ministry would touch the lives of the poor and the outcast, eminently seen in his work to collect the contribution for the struggling church in Jerusalem (2 Cor 8: 16-17). Acting in a diplomatic capacity as Paul's courier of the "painful" letter to the Corinthian church, Titus' diplomatic efforts elicit Paul's praise: "God . . . consoled us by the arrival of Titus, and not only by his coming, but also by the consolation with which he was consoled about

you" (2 Cor 7: 6-7). The Epistle to Titus indicates that Paul appointed him as bishop of Crete (Titus 1: 4-5).
