### + WORD: Genesis 16:1-6 CEV

Abram's wife Sarai had not been able to have any children. But she owned a young Egyptian slave woman named Hagar, <sup>2</sup> and Sarai said to Abram, "The LORD has not given me any children. Sleep with my slave, and if she has a child, it will be mine." Abram agreed, <sup>3</sup> and Sarai gave him Hagar to be his wife. This happened after Abram had lived in the

land of Canaan for ten years. <sup>4</sup> Later, when Hagar knew she was going to have a baby, she became proud and was hateful to Sarai.

<sup>5</sup> Then Sarai said to Abram, "It's all your fault! I gave you my slave woman, but she has been hateful to me ever since she found out she was pregnant. You have done me wrong, and you will have to answer to the LORD for this."

# + CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*. **This is what your holy** <u>prophets</u> an-*nounced*:

### + THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead: he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. From there he shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

#### + COMMEMORATION: ROMEY PITT MARSHALL

Romey Pitt Marshall (1901-1985) started out in the Florida Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South as a boy evangelist. In later years he recalled how, with the coming of the Great Depression, he had lost his faith. He discovered another man who had also lost his faith, and as they poured out their hearts to each other and struggled together they recovered their faith step by step. But it was a more mature faith than the one they had lost, and for Marshall it was a strongly Wesleyan faith. After serving as a pastor in the Florida Conference (1932-1936), he was Editor of "The Florida Christian Advocate" (1936-1941) and Associate Editor of "The Christian Advocate" in Chicago (1941-1943).

Returning to pastorates in the Florida (1943-1949) and Central Pennsylvania (1949-1955) Conferences, he was a forceful advocate whose beliefs had been tested by adversity and continued to be tested daily in local congregations. In the mid 1940s he wrote articles for "The Pastor", a journal for Methodist clergy, urging renewal through a return to a Wesleyan faith and spirituality that combined the evangelistic with the sacramental. He was a member of his Conference Board of Evangelism and gave lectures to clergy on evangelistic preaching.

On September 12, 1946 in the offices of the Board of Missions at the Methodist Building in New York City, he and three other Methodist clergy met and founded the Brotherhood of Saint Luke, renamed the Order of Saint Luke at its first convocation in 1948. Marshall was its first Director, a title later changed to President. His "Liturgical Question Box" column in "The Pastor," which lasted until that journal's demise in 1956, gave practical answers to numerous questions asked by Methodist pastors, most of whom had never taken a course in worship other than preaching.

While serving as Editor of "The North Carolina Christian Advocate" (1955-1960), Marshall's health broke and he took a small congregation in the Central Pennsylvania Conference until his retirement in 1967. In 1962 he gave up the presidency of the Order but retained the largely honorary office of Director and was later named President Emeritus. He continued to be active in the Order and on its Executive Committee through the 1960s, even after his retirement, until failing health made this impossible. He was well acquainted with progressive Roman Catholic life and thought and was enthusiastic about the work of the Second Vatican Council. After many years of ill health he was, as the Salvation Army puts it, "promoted to glory" on February 26, 1985. His eloquent witness of Wesleyan faith and spirituality in the face of severe personal challenges has continued to be an inspiration, for which we honor him.
