+ SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

+ WORD: 1 Corinthians 9:1-16 VOICE

Am I not truly free? Am I not an emissary of the Liberating *King*? Have I not personally encountered Jesus our Lord? Are you not my work, *my mission* in the Lord? ² Even if others don't recognize that I am His emissary, at least you do because you are the seal, *the living proof* that the Lord commissioned me to be His representative.

³ Let me speak in my own defense against those *keeping themselves* busy picking me apart. ⁴ Have we lost the right to eat and drink? ⁵ Have we lost the right to bring along our wives, our sisters in Jesus? Other emissaries travel with

their wives, and so do the brothers of our Lord, not to mention Cephas. ⁶ Is it just Barnabas and I who have lost the right to earn a living? ⁷ Is a soldier in combat required to pay his own salary? Who would plant a vineyard and not enjoy one grape from it? Who would care for *and nurture* a flock but never taste the fresh milk?

⁸ These ideas aren't based on merely human notions; the law says these same things. ⁹ In Moses' law, it is written: "Do not muzzle the ox while it is treading out your grain." Is God's concern here limited to oxen, ¹⁰ or does He speak here ultimately for our benefit? These things were written for us, so as the plowman plows and the worker gathers, they can labor with the hopeful expectation that they, too, will share in the good harvest. ¹¹ *The same principle applies here:* Is it too much to ask that we would be compensated materially for planting *life- and world-changing* spiritual realities? ¹² If you have rightfully supported others, shouldn't we deserve your support even more?

But we have never insisted on this right; instead, we would rather put up with anything than to put some obstacle in the way that prevents *even one person from experiencing* the good news of the Anointed One. ¹³ Perhaps it has escaped your notice that leaders and priests of the temple make their livings off the temple and that those who tend the altar eat their dinners from part of the sacrifices. ¹⁴ So *it shouldn't be a stretch that* the Lord has arranged for preachers of the gospel to make a living by *those who have embraced and been liberated by* the gospel.

¹⁵ *Despite what I've said here,* I have never staked a claim for such things, and I have no intention to start now; that's not why I'm writing. I would rather die than have anyone *(including me)* invalidate my right to boast. ¹⁶ You see, if I preach the good news, it's nothing to brag about. *This urgency,* this necessity has been laid on me. In fact, if I were to stop sharing this good news, I'd be in big trouble.

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

+ THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. From there he shall come again to judge the living and the dead. + COMMEMORATION: PHILIPP JAKOB SPENER

Spener served as the senior of the Lutheran clergy at Frankfurt/ Main from 1666-86. Here in 1670 he created the "collegia pietatis," small renewal groups. In 1675 his best known work, the Pia Desideria, appeared. It lamented church corruption and called for reform not in doctrine, but in life. Six reform proposals were offered: (1) more extensive use of the word of God, (2) establishment of the spiritual priesthood, i.e., more animated lay religious activity, (3) emphasis on a Christianity given to doing as well as to knowing, (4) loving behavior in religious controversy, (5) reform of theological education with a focus on faith and piety as well as academic preparation, and (6) the preaching of edifying sermons that would produce faith and its fruits.

Spener stressed the Wiedergeburt (the New Birth) and the daily renewal by the Holy Spirit that must follow it. He insisted that three things happen in the New Birth: faith is ignited in the heart; newborn persons have their sins forgiven, are justified, and are adopted as God's children; and an entirely other and new nature is created in them. Faith ought to eventuate in love. "Indeed, love is the whole life of the man who has faith and who through his faith is saved, and his fulfillment of the laws of God consists of love."
