+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

+ COMMEMORATION: BRIGID OF KILDARE

Sometimes known as "the Mary of the Gael," Brigid was born in 451 or 452, possibly to a slave of her father. ... Rejecting offers of marriage, Brigid became a nun and eventually settled in Druin Criadh, where, under a large oak tree, she erected the Convent of Cill-Dara, that is, "the church of the oak" (now Kildare). Two monastic communities, one for men and one for women, developed at Kildare. Brigid chose St Conleth to govern the communities along with herself, the first of a centuries-long double line of abbot-bishops and abbesses ruling those communities. The monasteries at Kildare became a center of religion and learning, and Brigid became a woman of much influence within religious and secular society.

In addition to this remarkable monastic community, Brigid's convent at Kildare was home to artisans and calligraphers. A "Book of Kildare," presumed lost during the Reformation, was said to have been incomparable in the beauty of its illuminations.

Brigid's friendship with St Patrick was well recorded in early manuscripts. The eighth century "Book of Armagh," tantalizingly tells us that "Between Patrick and Brigid, pillars of the Irish, there was so great a friendship that they were of one heart and one mind."[xci]

At her death, Brigid was attended by St. Ninnidh who administered the viaticum. He came to be called "Ninnidh of the Clean Hand" because he had his right hand encased with a metal covering to prevent its ever being defiled after this event.

Today, St Brigid lends her name to a community of men and women established by Mary Ewing Stamps out of The Upper Room's interest to explore monasticism in an ecumenical context. The community was blessed on February 1, 2000 at its first home on the grounds of Saint John's Abbey in Collegeville, Minnesota; it is now located in Saint Joseph, Minnesota, near Saint Benedict's Monastery. St Brigid's and its oblates are "women and men, United Methodist and others, lay and ordained, young and old" whose guiding sources are "Scripture, the Rule of Saint Benedict, the Benedictine Breviary, and Methodist texts such as the United Methodist Hymnal, the Book of Discipline, and the writings of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism."
