+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

+ THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God. the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ. his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven. and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. + COMMEMORATION: KANICHI MIYAMA

Kanichi Miyama was the first legal Japanese immigrant to the United States to be baptized a Christian. He was also the first Japanese ordained in the U.S.

Miyama was born into a samuri family in Hagi, Yamaguchi Ken, Japan on October 25 1847. As a student he came under the influence of the famous teacher, Yoshida Shoin

who favored opening Japan to Western knowledge and influence. Unable to pass an Army physical examination, Miyama traveled to America. Landing in San Francisco with no knowledge of English he enrolled in a class taught by Dr. Otis Gibson, the superintendent of the Chinese Methodist Mission in Chinatown, San Francisco. This relationship eventually led to his baptism by Gibson on this date in 1877. Miyama organized a Gospel Society for Japanese immigrants in October, 1877, from which grew the first Japanese Methodist church in America (now known as Pine United Methodist Church). Miyama was appointed to the congregation in 1884 as an assistant to Gibson.

Ordained deacon in 1886, the next year Miyama became an elder and full member of the then California Conference and was appointed to do Mission work to the Japanese in Hawaii. With support from the meager earnings of the members of the Japanese church in San Francisco, he sailed to Honolulu and began his evangelistic work among the Japanese laborers. He came back to San Francisco once, but returned to Hawaii in 1888 and founded the first Methodist Church in Hawaii with 38 members (now the Harris Memorial Methodist Church of Honolulu). In the conference year of 1888-89, Miyama baptized 155 persons, among them Ando Taro, the Japanese consul general.

Miyama returned to Japan in 1890 and founded the Ginza Church in Tokyo. He went on to found churches in the cities of Nagoya and Kamakura. He was also a great crusader for the temperance movement.
