¹ The same thing occurred in Iconium, where Paul and Barnabas went into the Jewish synagogue and spoke in

such a way that a great number of both Jews and Greeks became believers. ² But the unbelieving Jews stirred up the Gentiles and poisoned their minds against the brothers. ³ So they remained for a long time, speaking boldly for the Lord, who testified to the word of his grace by granting signs and wonders to be done through them. ⁴ But the residents of the city were divided; some sided with the Jews, and some with the apostles. ⁵ And when an attempt was made by both Gentiles and Jews, with their rulers, to mistreat them and to stone them, ⁶ the apostles learned of it and fled to Lystra and Derbe, cities of Lycaonia, and to the surrounding country; ⁷ and there they continued proclaiming the good news.

+ COMMEMORATION: HUGH PRICE HUGHES

Hugh Price Hughes was probably the most prominent Methodist Minister in Great Britain during the final quarter of the 19th Century. He was talented, eloquent and zealous. His ministry was marked by what has been called "Christian audacity," which led him also to be dubbed "judgement day in trousers."

Hughes' name is particularly associated with the "Forward Movement" and the resulting foundation of the West London Mission. He became Superintendent of that Mission in 1887, but only after he received a concession that he be allowed to stay beyond the normal 3 years. Hughes was now at the head of the largest work ever undertaken by Methodism, which included Mission halls, large evangelistic enterprises, social action, and entertainments. Under Hughes' leadership the Forward Movement transformed the Wesleyan Methodist Church from a sect into a Church that was capable of addressing the whole nation on major issues.

Hughes insistence that it was possible to have refined liturgy, revival, and social action became characteristic of British Methodism in the 20th Century. He died in 1902 while walking home from a meeting at the West London Mission. After his death David Lloyd-George, later Prime Minister of

Great Britain, declared that his fellow countryman was "the greatest Welshman who had ever lived."
