+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

+ THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. From there he shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

+ COMMEMORATION: ABSALOM JONES

Absalom Jones, the first Black priest of the Protestant Episcopal Church, served his people as a caring priest and a leader of the African-American community. Jones was born a slave in Sussex, Delaware in 1746. At sixteen, Absalom was taken to Philadelphia. There he learned to write and began attending night school. In Pennsylvania during Jones' lifetime, "universal freedom" was a prevailing notion among many whites, and a law passed in 1780 in Pennsylvania called for the eventual abolition of slavery.

It was in this context that Jones became an active member in the mostly white congregation of St. George's Methodist Episcopal Church. By 1787, Black membership had increased along with white resentment. One Sunday, white church trustees asked Jones, Richard Allen, and other Black worshippers to move to the newly built gallery, trying to pull them off their knees while in prayer. He then led other Black members out of the church following the service. They would not worship at St. George's again.

That group voted to affiliate with the Protestant Episcopal Church rather than the Methodist Episcopal Church, and on July 17, 1794 the St. Thomas African Episcopal Church was dedicated with Jones as its first ordained priest. Father Jones was known for his frequent visitations, strong pastoral qualities, and constant support of the advancement of Black people. While never forgetting the evils of slavery, he preached a message of liberation without bitterness.[xcix] In 1793, during a yellow fever epidemic, he and other parishioners cared for the sick. St. Thomas organized schools and mutual aid societies, and in 1799 and 1800, Jones was involved with petitioning the state legislature and Congress to end slavery.
