+ WORD: Matthew 9:2-13 NRSV

² And just then some people were carrying a paralyzed man lying on a bed. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Take heart, son; your sins are forgiven."

³ Then some of the scribes said to themselves, "This man is blaspheming." ⁴ But Jesus, perceiving their thoughts, said, "Why do you think evil in your hearts? ⁵ For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Stand up and walk'? ⁶ But so that you may know that the Son of

Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" - he then said to the paralytic - "Stand up, take your bed and go to your home." ⁷ And he stood up and went to his home. ⁸ When the crowds saw it, they were filled with awe, and they glorified God, who had given such authority to human beings.

⁹ As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him.

¹⁰ And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. ¹¹ When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" ¹² But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ¹³ Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners."

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

+ THE APOSTLE'S CREED

+ COMMEMORATION: FREDERICK DOUGLASS

In February of 1818 in Talbot County, Maryland, Harriet Bailey, an African-American slave woman, gave birth to a son, Frederick Augustus Washington Bailey. Although born in "the dark night of slavery," this son would become one of the leading lights in the nineteenth-century American abolitionist movement, a celebrated author and a social reformer. After escaping from slavery in 1838, he changed his name to Frederick Douglass, a change symbolic of his new identity. Douglass was no stranger to the physical and psychic indignities of slavery, of course, but he stood firm in his hope.

After his escape from slavery, Douglass was hired by the abolitionist William Lloyd Garrison and began an extensive lecture tour in the United States and Europe, exposing the atrocities of slavery and advocating social reform. His literary and rhetorical abilities propelled him into national prominence and he enjoyed a distinguished but turbulent career as a champion of human rights.
