+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

This is what your holy <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate *us*; mercy a-mong our *ancestors*, and remembrance of your <u>ho</u>-ly *covenant*. + COMMEMORATION: Fred McFeely Rogers

Fred Rogers — or, Mister Rogers, as he was affectionately known to legions of fans of his children's television program, Mister Rogers' Neighborhood — was a neighbor to children of all ages. Born in Latrobe, in the hills of western Pennsylvania, he spent much of his life in the Pittsburgh area where he was an indefatigable advocate for children. Mister Rogers received a BA degree in music composition from Rollins College (Florida) in 1951. Following graduation, he returned to the Pittsburgh area and began his career in television as a puppeteer on a live, unscripted children's program, The Children's Corner. During his seven-year association with this program, Rogers learned the craft of television programming while developing some of the characters and music used in his later work on Mister Rogers' Neighborhood.

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Rogers' original intent to study theology was realized as he took courses at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary during his years with The Children's Corner. During this time he also studied Child Development in the graduate school of the University of Pittsburgh. By the time of his ordination to ministry in the Presbyterian Church in 1962, he had determined that his calling lay in a kind of children's ministry through television.

The prototype for his long-running television series was developed during a three-year stint as host of a children's program, Misterogers, in Toronto, Canada, for the CBC. In 1966 Rogers acquired the rights to this program and incorporated elements of it into a new show he developed for Public Television in the United States. In 1968 Mister Rogers' Neighborhood debuted on what was then National Educational Television (now the PBS network), where it continues to hold the distinction of being the longest running show on PBS.

Fred Rogers pioneered the concept that adult topics are suitable for conversation with children so long as these conversations are handled with sensitivity and restraint. In his television show he utilized puppets and live actors in the "Neighborhood of Make-Believe" to mirror the fears and anxieties faced by children in coming to terms with the world around them. Other segments dealt with issues faced by children such as doctor's visits, sibling rivalry, school, politics, and even death. He encouraged children to question, and encouraged adults to reply honestly to their questions.

Rogers was also a pioneer in the field of faith and values, demonstrating what it means to be a person of faith without resorting to denominational or political parochialism. His gentle and sensitive respect for the personhood of children is a model for all persons in bringing Christ to life in the lives of Christians.
