¹⁴ But thank God, who is always leading us around through Christ as if we were in a parade. + CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*. This is what your holy <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate <u>us</u>; mercy a-<u>mong</u> our <u>ancestors</u>, and remembrance of your <u>ho</u>-ly covenant. This is the promise you swore to our <u>an</u>-cestor, *Abraham*, to make us <u>un</u>-a-*fraid*, to rescue us from our *enemies*, to serve before you, holy and just, all the days <u>of</u> our *lives*. + THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. + COMMEMORATION: FANNY JANE CROSBY

Fanny Crosby, born in 1820, went blind at six weeks of age but her disability did not prevent her from becoming the most prolific writer of hymns in American history. A precocious child who began writing verse at age eight, she eventually became a teacher of grammar, rhetoric, and history at the New York School for the Blind. Her hymnody, which is well represented in The United Methodist Hymnal (1989), continues to be a powerful influence on the worship experience of United Methodists.

Crosby began her hymn-writing career shortly after her marriage to Alexander Van Alstyne in 1858 and eventually produced more than eight thousand hymns. It has been noted that "much of the writing was done to order. For Biglow and Main (her publishers) she produced three hymns a week." A lifelong Methodist, she often visited services in missions throughout Manhattan. After one such visit, she came away convinced that no one was beyond redemption. She wrote that it was the duty of the Christian to

Rescue the perishing, care for the dying, Snatch them in pity from sin and the grave, Weep o'er the erring one, lift up the fallen, Tell them of Jesus, the mighty to save (UMH 591).

Her most enduring and beloved hymns speak of a personal and heartfelt devotion to Christ: "To God be the glory, great things He hath done!" (UMH 98), "Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross" (UMH 301), "Pass Me Not, O Gentle Savior" (UMH 351), "Close to Thee" (UMH 407), and "I Am Thine, O Lord" (UMH 419).

Her deep roots in Wesleyan spirituality are evident in her beloved hymn, "Blessed Assurance, Jesus is Mine" (UMH 369):

Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine! O what a foretaste of glory divine! Heir of salvation, purchase of God, Born of his Spirit, washed in his blood. This is my story, this is my song, Praising my Savior all the day long.
