All of these crowds came because they had heard what Jesus was doing. ⁹ He even had to tell his disciples to get a boat ready to keep him from being crushed by the crowds.

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

+ COMMEMORATION: SCHOLASTICA

Scholastica is a saint of the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Churches. She is the foundress of the women's branch of Benedictine Monasticism.

According to the Dialogues of Gregory the Great, Scholastica was born c. 480 in Nursia, Umbria, of wealthy parents. While Gregory states that Scholastica was Benedict's sister, a later tradition, says she was his twin. Whether this is meant biologically or allegorically (spiritually) or both is not clear. Gregory the Great says she was dedicated to God from a young age. She and her

brother Benedict were brought up together until the time he left to pursue studies in Rome.

Benedictine tradition holds that Scholastica established a hermitage about five miles from Monte Cassino and that this was the first "Benedictine" convent.
