+ WORD: Matthew 4:1-11 CEV

The Holy Spirit led Jesus into the desert, so that the devil could test him. ² After Jesus had gone without eating for forty days and nights, he was very hungry. ³Then the

devil came to him and said, "If you are God's Son, tell these stones to turn into bread." ⁴ Jesus answered, "The Scriptures say: 'No one can live only on food. People need every word that God has spoken." ⁵ Next, the devil took Jesus to the holy city and had him stand on the highest part of the temple. ⁶ The devil said, "If you are God's Son, jump off. The Scriptures say: 'God will give his angels orders about you. They will catch you in their arms. and you won't hurt your feet on the stones." ⁷ Jesus answered, "The Scriptures also say, 'Don't try to test the Lord your God!" ⁸ Finally, the devil took Jesus up on a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms on earth and their power.⁹ The devil said to him, "I will give all this to you, if you will bow down and worship me." ¹⁰ Jesus answered, "Go away Satan! The Scriptures say: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve only him."

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*. **This is what your holy** <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate <u>us</u>; mercy a-<u>mong</u> our <u>ancestors</u>, and remembrance of your <u>ho</u>-ly <u>covenant</u>. This is the promise you swore to our <u>an</u>-cestor, *Abraham*, to make us <u>un</u>-a-*fraid*, to rescue us from our *enemies*, to serve before you, holy and just, all the days <u>of</u> our *lives*. And this, my little child, shall be called prophet of <u>the</u> Most *High*, going before you, Adonai, to pre-<u>pare</u> your *paths*, making your people <u>know</u> de-*liverance* by the forgiveness <u>of</u> their *sins*. Through your merciful compassions, <u>God</u> our *God*, the dawn from on <u>high</u> shall *visit us*, to shine on those kept in dungeons and the <u>shadows</u> of *death* and to guide our feet onto the <u>path</u> of *peace*. Glory to you, O Trinity, most <u>holy</u> and *blessed*, one God, now and for-ever, A-*men*.

+ THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. From there he shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

+ COMMEMORATION: MATTHIAS

Matthias was chosen an apostle to replace Judas Iscariot after his betrayal of Jesus. In the account in Acts 1: 15-26, Peter suggests that Judas' replacement must be someone who had been with Jesus from his baptism until the ascension and was a witness to the resurrection. Two qualified candidates come forward, Joseph Barsabbas and Matthias (because of this, the early church tradition placed Matthias in the seventy sent out by Jesus to preach even though his name is not mentioned there or elsewhere in the New Testament). The disciples then use the Old Testament practice of casting lots. The two names are written on stones, which, after a prayer for guidance, are shaken together in a bag. The first stone to come out indicates that Matthias is chosen. "Matthias," in fact, means "gift of God," fitting for the one believed by the early Christian community to have been selected by God. He is an example to us that willing witnesses will come forth to serve the Lord in the place of those who turn away.

According to tradition, Matthias' mission field included Palestine, Cappodocia, and Ethiopia. Origen referred to a Gospel of Matthias, although no such text has survived. One apocryphal story claims that while in Macedonia, Matthias drank a poison that was supposed to cause blindness. Not only was he unharmed, he healed 250 persons who had been blinded by the poison. In another story he is bound and thrown into prison but the Lord appears in a great light and sets him free. After this, Matthias tells his tormentors, "Ye shall go to Hell alive," and the earth opens and swallows them. As a result of this miracle, many others are then converted.[cvii]

Tradition also holds Matthias to have been a martyr, although the stories of his martyrdom vary, one claiming that he was crucified and then hacked with a halberd (or ax), another that he was beheaded and stoned. He is

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remembered on this day in the Episcopal and Lutheran calendars, but his celebration has recently been moved in the Roman Catholic Church to May 14th, between the Ascension and Pentecost, the period during which he was chosen to be an apostle.
