- ³⁵ He turns a desert into pools of water, a parched land into springs of water.

* WORD: John 6:60-71 CEV

⁶⁰ Many of Jesus' disciples heard him and said, "This is too hard for anyone to understand."

61 Jesus knew that his disciples were grumbling. So he asked, "Does this bother you? 62 What if you should see the Son of Man go up to heaven where he came from? 63 The Spirit is the one who gives life! Human strength can do nothing. The words that I have spoken to you are from that life-giving Spirit. 64 But some of you refuse to have faith in me." Jesus said this, because from the beginning he knew who would have faith in him. He also knew which one would betray him.

⁵ Then Jesus said, "You cannot come to me, unless the Father makes you want to come. That is why I have told these things to all of you."

⁶⁶ Because of what Jesus said, many of his disciples turned their backs on him and stopped following him.
⁶⁷ Jesus then asked his twelve disciples if they were going to leave him.
⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered, "Lord, there is no one else that we can go to! Your words give eternal life.
⁶⁹ We have faith in you, and we are sure that you are God's Holy One."

⁷⁰ Jesus told his disciples, "I chose all twelve of you, but one of you is a demon!" ⁷¹ Jesus was talking about Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot. He would later betray Jesus, even though he was one of the twelve disciples.

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, God of Israel,

for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

This is what your holy <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate *us*; mercy a-mong our *ancestors*, and remembrance of your <u>ho</u>-ly *covenant*.

* THE APOSTLE'S CREED

+ COMMEMORATION: Cuthbert of Lindisfarne (687)

Cuthbert is among the better-known early British saints, owing to Bede's account of his life, to stories of the miraculous preservation of his body after death, and to the transfer of his remains and other relics to the Cathedral of Durham, where they rest to this day.

Cuthbert grew up like any other Northumbrian boy, as Bede tells it, fully as committed to games, pranks, and competition as his peers, with no proclivities toward monastic life. That changed in his seventeenth year, when, on his regular night watch as a shepherd, he saw angels descending to accompany a departing soul to heaven. Immediately, he resolved to enter a monastery. Later he learned that his vision coincided with the death of Aidan, first bishop of Lindisfarne, and founder of the monastery there.
