* WORD: John 17:1-11 CEV

After Jesus had finished speaking to his disciples, he looked up toward heaven and prayed:

Father, the time has come for you to bring glory to your Son, in order that he may bring glory to you. ² And you gave him power over all people, so that he would give eternal life to everyone you give him. ³ Eternal life is to know you, the only true God, and to know Jesus Christ, the one you sent. ⁴ I have brought glory to you here on earth by doing everything you gave me to do. ⁵ Now, Father, give me back the glory that I had with you before the world was created.

⁶ You have given me some followers from this world, and I have shown them what you are like. They were yours, but

you gave them to me, and they have obeyed you. ⁷ They know that you gave me everything I have. ⁸ I told my followers what you told me, and they accepted it. They know that I came from you, and they believe that you are the one who sent me. ⁹ I am praying for them, but not for those who belong to this world. My followers belong to you, and I am praying for them. ¹⁰ All that I have is yours, and all that you have is mine, and they will bring glory to me.

¹¹ Holy Father, I am no longer in the world. I am coming to you, but my followers are still in the world. So keep them safe by the power of the name that you have given me. Then they will be one with each other, just as you and I are one.

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*.

You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

This is what your holy <u>prophets</u> an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of <u>all</u> who hate *us*; mercy a-mong our *ancestors*, and remembrance of your <u>ho</u>-ly *covenant*.

* COMMEMORATION: John Donne (tr 3/31)

Donne was born into a wealthy Roman Catholic family in Protestant England in 1572. The imprisonment and death of his younger brother drove John to investigate the debates which rent the Church: "Show me, dear Christ, thy spouse, so bright and clear" was his earnest prayer. Eventually accepting Anglicanism, Donne embarked on a promising career in government service. After an illegal marriage with Ann More (the niece of Lord Ellesmere) brought his political career to a standstill, Donne strove to gain new patrons, dedicating religious and commemorative poetry to nobles and religious tracts to the king, who several times urged him to accept ordination. Donne wrestled with his vocation for forty-two years before finally abandoning secular in favor of ecclesiastical ambition. His ordination in 1615 was a coming home: "I date my life from my Ministry; for I received mercy, as I received the Ministry."
