+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

Thomas Ware was an early Methodist circuit rider. His memoirs, <u>Sketches in the Life and Travels of</u> <u>Rev. Thomas Ware</u> (1839), reveal a faithful soul engaged

in the difficult work of a traveling preacher. They also give us unique insights into the formation of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

Ware was born in Greenwich, New Jersey on December 19, 1758. Trained as a Calvinist and although he had a strong religious bent, he did not fully appreciate the deeper aspects of religion until his entrance into the Revolutionary War as a soldier. Ware's military service was cut short when he contracted "swamp fever," and was discharged. He soon joined the Methodists and was sent by Asbury to the Dover circuit in 1783.

In his memoirs he tells the story of meeting up with a minister from another denomination, who, seeing that he was always traveling, asked if he were a missionary. Ware writes, "I replied that I was a Methodist, and we were all missionaries."
