+ WORD: Jeremiah 25:8-17 CEV

⁸ You refused to listen to me, ⁹ and now I will let you be attacked by nations from the north, and especially by my servant, King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylonia. You and other nearby nations will be destroyed and left in ruins forever. Everyone who sees what has happened will be shocked, but they will still make fun of you. ¹⁰ I will put an end to your parties and wedding celebrations; no one will grind grain or be here to light the lamps at night. ¹¹ This country will be as empty as a desert, because I will make all of you the slaves of the king of Babylonia for seventy years.

¹² When that time is up, I will punish the king of Babylonia and his people for everything they have done wrong, and I

will turn that country into a wasteland forever. ¹³ My servant Jeremiah has told you what I said I will do to Babylonia and to the other nations, and he wrote it all down in this book. I will do everything I threatened. ¹⁴ I will pay back the Babylonians for every wrong they have done. Great kings from many other nations will conquer the Babylonians and force them to be slaves.

¹⁵The LORD God of Israel showed me a vision in which he said, "Jeremiah, here is a cup filled with the wine of my anger. Take it and make every nation drink some. ¹⁶ They will vomit and act crazy, because of the war this cup of anger will bring to them."

¹⁷ I took the cup from the LORD's hand, and I went to the kings of the nations and made each of them drink some.

+ WORD: John 9:18-41 CEV

¹⁸ But the Jewish leaders would not believe that the man had once been blind. They sent for his parents ¹⁹ and asked them, "Is this the son that you said was born blind? How can he now see?"

²⁰ The man's parents answered, "We are certain that he is our son, and we know that he was born blind. ²¹ But we don't know how he got his sight or who gave it to him. Ask him! He is old enough to speak for himself."

²²⁻²³ The man's parents said this because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders. The leaders had already agreed that no one was to have anything to do with anyone who said Jesus was the Messiah.

- ²⁴ The leaders called the man back and said, "Swear by God to tell the truth! We know that Jesus is a sinner."
- ²⁵ The man replied, "I don't know if he is a sinner or not. All I know is that I used to be blind, but now I can see!"
- ²⁶ "What did he do to you?" the Jewish leaders asked. "How did he heal your eyes?"
- ²⁷ The man answered, "I have already told you once, and you refused to listen. Why do you want me to tell you again? Do you also want to become his disciples?"
- ²⁸ The leaders insulted the man and said, "You are his follower! We are followers of Moses. ²⁹ We are sure that God spoke to Moses, but we don't even know where Jesus comes from."
- ³⁰ "How strange!" the man replied. "He healed my eyes, and yet you don't know where he comes from. ³¹ We know that God listens only to people who love and obey him. God doesn't listen to sinners. ³² And this is the first time in history that anyone has ever given sight to someone born blind. ³³ Jesus could not do anything unless he came from God."
- ³⁴ The leaders told the man, "You have been a sinner since the day you were born! Do you think you can teach

- us anything?" Then they said, "You can never come back into any of our meeting places!"
- ³⁵ When Jesus heard what had happened, he went and found the man. Then Jesus asked, "Do you have faith in the Son of Man?"
- ³⁶ He replied, "Sir, if you will tell me who he is, I will put my faith in him."
- ³⁷ "You have already seen him," Jesus answered, "and right now he is talking with you."
- ³⁸ The man said, "Lord, I put my faith in you!" Then he worshiped Jesus.
- ³⁹ Jesus told him, "I came to judge the people of this world. I am here to give sight to the blind and to make blind everyone who can see."
- ⁴⁰ When the Pharisees heard Jesus say this, they asked, "Are we blind?"
- ⁴¹ Jesus answered, "If you were blind, you would not be guilty. But now that you claim to see, you will keep on being guilty."

+ CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

+ COMMEMORATION: Martin and Henry Boehm

Martin Boehm, born in a German Mennonite home in 1725, was chosen by lot in 1756 to be a preacher. The following year he was chosen a Mennonite bishop, again by lot. Influenced by George Whitefield, he joined with other evangelical ministers in "great meetings." One of these was held in 1767 at Isaac Long's barn in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. On Pentecost Sunday, Boehm preached there to an overflow crowd, among whom was a Reformed pastor, Philip William Otterbein, who rushed forward and embraced Boehm, exclaiming: "Wir sind Brüder" (we are brethren).

Martin's son Henry began to itinerate as a preacher of the Methodist Episcopal Church at the age of 25 and was a traveling companion of Asbury. At Asbury's request he oversaw the translation of the 1805 Discipline into German and was later appointed presiding elder and held pastorates in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.
