like one who finds great spoil.

- <sup>163</sup> I hate and abhor falsehood,but I love your law.
- <sup>164</sup> Seven times a day I praise you for your righteous ordinances.
- <sup>165</sup> Great peace have those who love your law; nothing can make them stumble.
- <sup>166</sup> I hope for your salvation, O LORD, and I fulfill your commandments.
- <sup>167</sup> My soul keeps your decrees;

I love them exceedingly.

- <sup>168</sup> I keep your precepts and decrees, for all my ways are before you.
- <sup>169</sup> Let my cry come before you, O LORD;
  give me understanding according to your word.
  <sup>170</sup> Let my supplication come before you;
  - deliver me according to your promise.

<sup>171</sup> My lips will pour forth praise, because you teach me your statutes. <sup>172</sup> My tongue will sing of your promise, for all your commandments are right. <sup>173</sup> Let your hand be ready to help me, for I have chosen your precepts. <sup>174</sup> I long for your salvation, O LORD, and your law is my delight. <sup>175</sup> Let me live that I may praise you, and let your ordinances help me. <sup>176</sup> I have gone astray like a lost sheep; seek out your servant. for I do not forget your commandments. ### + WORD: John 10:1-18 CEV

"Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. <sup>2</sup> The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. <sup>3</sup> The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. <sup>4</sup> When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. <sup>5</sup> They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." <sup>6</sup> Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

<sup>7</sup> So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. <sup>8</sup> All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them.
<sup>9</sup> I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. <sup>10</sup> The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

<sup>11</sup> "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. <sup>12</sup> The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. <sup>13</sup> The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. <sup>14</sup> I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, <sup>15</sup> just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup> I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. <sup>17</sup> For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. <sup>18</sup> No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."
