*** OPENING CALL TO PRAISE AND PRAYER**

O God, open our lips, *and our mouths shall proclaim your praise.* From the rising of the sun to its setting, *we praise your name, O God.*

* REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM

By Word and water God renews us this day in the living fountain of God's grace, and raises us with Christ Jesus to live a new life in the Spirit. * OSL Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, O God, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days.

* CANTICLE OF THE RESURRECTION

Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; therefore let us keep the feast, not with the old leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives, he lives to God.

So consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.

* MORNING PRAYER

The Holy One* be with you; *And also with you.*

* WORD: Daniel 6:1-15 CEV

Darius divided his kingdom into a hundred and twenty states and placed a governor in charge of each one. ² In order to make sure that his government was run properly, Darius put three other officials in charge of the governors. One of these officials was Daniel. ³ And he did his work so much better than the other governors and officials that the king decided to let him govern the whole kingdom.

⁴ The other men tried to find something wrong with the way Daniel did his work for the king. But they could not accuse him of anything wrong, because he was honest and faithful and did everything he was supposed to do. ⁵ Finally, they said to one another, "We will never be able to bring any charge against Daniel, unless it has to do with his religion."

⁶ They all went to the king and said:

Your Majesty, we hope you live forever! ⁷ All of your officials, leaders, advisors, and governors agree that you should make a law forbidding anyone to pray to any god or human except you for the next thirty days. Everyone who disobeys this law must be thrown into a pit of lions. ⁸ Order this to be written and then sign it, so it cannot be changed, just as no written law of the Medes and Persians can be changed."

⁹ So King Darius made the law and had it written down.

¹⁰ Daniel heard about the law, but when he returned home, he went upstairs and prayed in front of the window that faced Jerusalem. In the same way that he had always done, he knelt down in prayer three times a day, giving thanks to God.

¹¹ The men who had spoken to the king watched Daniel and saw him praying to his God for help. ¹² They went back to the king and said, "Didn't you make a law that forbids anyone to pray to any god or human except you for the next thirty days? And doesn't the law say that everyone who disobeys it will be thrown into a pit of lions?"

"Yes, that's the law I made," the king agreed. "And just like all written laws of the Medes and Persians, it cannot be changed."

¹³ The men then told the king, "That Jew named Daniel, who was brought here as a captive, refuses to obey you or the law that you ordered to be written. And he still prays to his god three times a day." ¹⁴ The king was really upset to hear about this, and for the rest of the day he tried to think how he could save Daniel.

¹⁵ At sunset the men returned and said, "Your Majesty, remember that no written law of the Medes and Persians can be changed, not even by the king."

* Psalm 105:1-22 NRSV

- ¹O give thanks to the LORD, call on his name, make known his deeds among the peoples.
- ² Sing to him, sing praises to him; tell of all his wonderful works.
- ³ Glory in his holy name;
 - let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice.
- ⁴ Seek the LORD and his strength;
 - seek his presence continually.
- ⁵ Remember the wonderful works he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he has uttered,
- ⁶ O offspring of his servant Abraham, children of Jacob, his chosen ones.
- ⁷ He is the LORD our God;
 - his judgments are in all the earth.
- ⁸ He is mindful of his covenant forever,
- of the word that he commanded, for a thousand generations,
- ⁹ the covenant that he made with Abraham, his sworn promise to Isaac,
- ¹⁰ which he confirmed to Jacob as a statute, to Israel as an everlasting covenant,
- ¹¹ saying, "To you I will give the land of Canaan as your portion for an inheritance."

- ¹² When they were few in number, of little account, and strangers in it, ¹³ wandering from nation to nation, from one kingdom to another people, ¹⁴ he allowed no one to oppress them; he rebuked kings on their account, ¹⁵ saying, "Do not touch my anointed ones; do my prophets no harm." ¹⁶ When he summoned famine against the land, and broke every staff of bread, ¹⁷ he had sent a man ahead of them, Joseph, who was sold as a slave. ¹⁸ His feet were hurt with fetters, his neck was put in a collar of iron; ¹⁹ until what he had said came to pass, the word of the LORD kept testing him.
- ²⁰ The king sent and released him; the ruler of the peoples set him free.
- ²¹ He made him lord of his house, and ruler of all his possessions,
 ²² to instruct his officials at his pleasure, and to teach his elders wisdom.

Alleluia!

* SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

WORD: Luke 5:12-26 CEV

¹² Jesus came to a town where there was a man who had leprosy. When the man saw Jesus, he knelt down to the ground in front of Jesus and begged, "Lord, you have the power to make me well, if only you wanted to."

¹³ Jesus put his hand on him and said, "I want to! Now you are well." At once the man's leprosy disappeared. ¹⁴ Jesus told him, "Don't tell anyone about this, but go and show yourself to the priest. Offer a gift to the priest, just as Moses commanded, and everyone will know that you have been healed."

¹⁵ News about Jesus kept spreading. Large crowds came to listen to him teach and to be healed of their diseases. ¹⁶ But Jesus would often go to some place where he could be alone and pray.

¹⁷ One day some Pharisees and experts in the Law of Moses sat listening to Jesus teach. They had come from every village in Galilee and Judea and from Jerusalem.

God had given Jesus the power to heal the sick, ¹⁸ and some people came carrying a crippled man on a mat. They tried to take him inside the house and put him in front of Jesus. ¹⁹ But because of the crowd, they could not get him to Jesus. So they went up on the roof, where they removed some tiles and let the mat down in the middle of the room.

²⁰ When Jesus saw how much faith they had, he said to the crippled man, "My friend, your sins are forgiven."

²¹ The Pharisees and the experts began arguing, "Jesus must think he is God! Only God can forgive sins."

²² Jesus knew what they were thinking, and he said, "Why are you thinking that? ²³ Is it easier for me to tell this crippled man that his sins are forgiven or to tell him to get up and walk? ²⁴ But now you will see that the Son of Man has the right to forgive sins here on earth." Jesus then said to the man, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk home."

²⁵ At once the man stood up in front of everyone. He picked up his mat and went home, giving thanks to God.
²⁶ Everyone was amazed and praised God. What they saw surprised them, and they said, "We have seen a great miracle today!"

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH We bless you, Adonai, God of Israel, for you come to visit us and ransom us from bondage. You have brought forth a strong De-liverer in the house of your child David.
