They didn't consider the prize they would win if they kept their whole beings free from stain. ²³ God created humans to live forever. * WORD: Luke 6:1-11 CEB

One Sabbath, as Jesus was going through the wheat fields, his disciples were picking the heads of wheat, rubbing them in their hands, and eating them. ² Some Pharisees said, "Why are you breaking the Sabbath law?"

³ Jesus replied, "Haven't you read what David and his companions did when they were hungry? ⁴ He broke the Law by going into God's house and eating the bread of the presence, which only the priests can eat. He also gave some of the bread to his companions." ⁵ Then he said to them, "The Human One is Lord of the Sabbath."

⁶ On another Sabbath, Jesus entered a synagogue to teach. A man was there whose right hand was withered. ⁷ The legal experts and the Pharisees were watching him closely to see if he would heal on the Sabbath. They were looking for a reason to bring charges against him. ⁸ Jesus knew their thoughts, so he said to the man with the withered hand, "Get up and stand in front of everyone." He got up and stood there. ⁹ Jesus said to the legal experts and Pharisees, "Here's a question for you: Is it legal on the Sabbath to do good or to do evil, to save life or to destroy it?" ¹⁰ Looking around at them all, he said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." * COMMEMORATION: MARK

The unnamed writer of the second gospel is traditionally associated with the John Mark mentioned in Acts as a missionary companion of Paul and Barnabas (Mark's cousin) and with the Mark that appears in 1 Peter 5: 13. Papias, a second century bishop, says that Mark was the "interpreter" of Peter's teaching of Jesus. This tradition, along with Mark's dependence on Peter, has been both defended and denied, depending on critical evaluation of the Papias tradition and on evidence internal to the gospel itself. Mark is the earliest of the four gospels and thus our Evangelist was the first to fashion the gospel genre as we know it. Although Eusebius says he went to Alexandria, we do not have reliable

information about where or when he died. His supposed remains were translated to Venice in the ninth century of which city he became the patron saint. The Evangelist is usually pictured as the winged lion of Ezekiel, recalling the majesty of Jesus, the Lion of Judah.
