I am going there to prepare a place for each of you. ³ After I have done this, I will come back and take you with me. Then we will be together. ⁴ You know the way to where I am going."

⁵ Thomas said, "Lord, we don't even know where you are going! How can we know the way?"

⁶ "I am the way, the truth, and the life!" Jesus answered. "Without me, no one can go to the Father. ⁷ If you had known me, you would have known the Father. But from now on, you do know him, and you have seen him."

⁸ Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father. That is all we need."

Philip, I have been with you for a long time. Don't you know who I am? If you have seen me, you have seen the Father. + COMMEMORATION:

George Miller, John Walter, and John Dreisbach

George Miller (1774-1816) and John Walter (1781-1819) were coworkers with Jacob Albright in founding the Evangelische Gemeinschaft (Evangelical Association) in Pennsylvania. Walter was converted through Albright's preaching and became his first assistant in 1802. He published the first hymnbook of the denomination in 1810 with fifty-six hymns including a number he had written. Tuberculosis forced him to stop itinerating in 1813, and he died at his home five years later.

God and began to preach under the direction of Albright and Walter. He was ordained elder at the first conference of the emerging church in 1807, but ill health kept him from accepting any definite appointment after 1809. At the urging of his church, he wrote the original draft of seventy-five pages for the first Discipline of the church, as well as a book of rules for conference business, and a biography of Jacob Albright. He died on this day in 1816.

John Dreisbach (1789-1871) was a charter member of the class established in November 1806 by Jacob Albright and his coworkers. His license to preach, granted in 1807, bears Albright's signature. A probationer only 18 years old, he was left alone on his first field by Albright's death and the

illness of his senior colleague, George Miller. He was elected the first presiding elder in 1814 and presided over most conference sessions of Albright's followers until his health broke in 1821. He dedicated the first church building and established the first printing concern of the Evangelical Association.
