¹⁶ So Darius ordered Daniel to be brought out and thrown into a pit of lions. But he said to Daniel, "You have been faithful to your God, and I pray that he will rescue you."

¹⁷ A stone was rolled over the pit, and it was sealed. Then Darius and his officials stamped the seal to show that no one should let Daniel out. ¹⁸ All night long the king could not sleep. He did not eat anything, and he would not let anyone come in to entertain him.

¹⁹ At daybreak the king got up and ran to the pit. ²⁰ He was anxious and shouted, "Daniel, you were faithful and

served your God. Was he able to save you from the lions?"

²¹ Daniel answered, "Your Majesty, I hope you live forever!
²² My God knew that I was innocent, and he sent an angel to keep the lions from eating me. Your Majesty, I have never done anything to hurt you."

²³ The king was relieved to hear Daniel's voice, and he gave orders for him to be taken out of the pit. Daniel's faith in his God had kept him from being harmed. ²⁴ And the king ordered the men who had brought charges against Daniel to be thrown into the pit, together with their wives and children. But before they even reached the bottom, the lions ripped them to pieces.

²⁵ King Darius then sent this message to all people of every nation and race in the world:

"Greetings to all of you!

²⁶ I command everyone in my kingdom

to worship and honor

the God of Daniel.

He is the living God,

the one who lives forever.

His power and his kingdom

will never end.

²⁷ He rescues people

and sets them free

by working great miracles.

Daniel's God has rescued him from the power of the lions."

²⁸ All went well for Daniel while Darius was king, and even when Cyrus the Persian ruled.

²⁷ Later, Jesus went out and saw a tax collector named Levi sitting at the place for paying taxes. Jesus said to him, "Come with me." ²⁸ Levi left everything and went with Jesus.

- ²⁹ In his home Levi gave a big dinner for Jesus. Many tax collectors and other guests were also there.
- ³⁰ The Pharisees and some of their teachers of the Law of Moses grumbled to Jesus' disciples, "Why do you eat and drink with those tax collectors and other sinners?"

- ³¹ Jesus answered, "Healthy people don't need a doctor, but sick people do. ³² I didn't come to invite good people to turn to God. I came to invite sinners."
- ³³ Some people said to Jesus, "John's followers often pray and go without eating, and so do the followers of the Pharisees. But your disciples never go without eating or drinking."
- ³⁴ Jesus told them, "The friends of a bridegroom don't go without eating while he is still with them. ³⁵ But the time will come when he will be taken from them. Then they will go without eating."
- ³⁶ Jesus then told them these sayings:

No one uses a new piece of cloth to patch old clothes.

The patch would shrink and make the hole even bigger.

- ³⁷ No one pours new wine into old wineskins. The new wine would swell and burst the old skins. Then the wine would be lost, and the skins would be ruined. ³⁸ New wine must be put only into new wineskins.
- ³⁹ No one wants new wine after drinking old wine. They say, "The old wine is better."

* COMMEMORATION: SAMUEL WESLEY

Samuel Wesley, the father of John and Charles Wesley, was rector of the parish of Epworth. Although his father was a nonconformist minister, Samuel returned to the Church of England and, after graduating from Exeter College, Oxford, was ordained a priest in 1689. He married Susanna Annesley while a curate in a London parish. With high church leanings, Samuel celebrated a monthly rather than quarterly Eucharist, urged the public rather than the private baptism of children, and encouraged the use of contemporary hymns rather than the "Old Version" Psalter. He achieved some fame for his prose and poetic writings, including a major work on the book of Job. He died on April 25, 1732.
