## \* 1st READING: Wisdom 4:16-5:8 CEB

<sup>16</sup> So the dead who did what's right will condemn the ungodly who are still alive, and someone who dies young will condemn the old person who has lived many years but hasn't done what is right. <sup>17</sup> People will see the death of the wise, but they won't understand the Lord's purposes for them, nor to what end the Lord kept them safe. <sup>18</sup> Instead, they will laugh at what they see. In the end, however, the Lord will have the last laugh on them.
<sup>19</sup> Then they will be no better than mutilated corpses, a scandal to the rest of the dead forever. The Lord will crush them and leave them lying there speechless. He will shake them from their very foundations. They will waste away in agony. Their memory will be wiped out. <sup>20</sup> They will cower when their sins are counted up. Their lawless deeds will witness against them and convict them.

5 Then the one who did do what was right will stand up with full confidence in the very midst of those who caused his suffering and made light of his distress. <sup>2</sup> They will tremble with great fear when they see him. They will be amazed that he was delivered so unexpectedly. <sup>3</sup> They will sing a different tune as they gasp and say to themselves: <sup>4</sup> He's the one we mocked?! He's the one we insulted? What idiots we were! We thought his life was madness and his death a disgrace. <sup>5</sup> How is it that he's now counted among God's children? How is it that he's now considered one of the saints?

<sup>6</sup> Clearly we were the ones who missed the way to truth. The light that would have shown us the right thing to do hasn't shone for us. That sun didn't rise upon us. <sup>7</sup> We got entangled in lawlessness and destruction. We wandered through desolate wildernesses. We didn't know the Lord's way.

<sup>8</sup> What good did our pride do us? What good were our wealth and pretension?

#### \* PSALM 119:49-72 NRSV

- <sup>49</sup> Remember your word to your servant, in which you have made me hope.
- <sup>50</sup> This is my comfort in my distress, that your promise gives me life.
  - 51 The arrogant utterly deride me, but I do not turn away from your law.
  - <sup>52</sup> When I think of your ordinances from of old, I take comfort, O LORD.
- <sup>53</sup> Hot indignation seizes me because of the wicked, those who forsake your law.
- <sup>54</sup> Your statutes have been my songs wherever I make my home.
  - <sup>55</sup> I remember your name in the night, O LORD, and keep your law.
  - 56 This blessing has fallen to me, for I have kept your precepts.
- <sup>57</sup> The LORD is my portion;I promise to keep your words.

- When I think of your ways,I turn my feet to your decrees;
  - 60 I hurry and do not delay to keep your commandments.

- <sup>63</sup> I am a companion of all who fear you, of those who keep your precepts.
- <sup>64</sup> The earth, O LORD, is full of your steadfast love; teach me your statutes.
- 65 You have dealt well with your servant,O LORD, according to your word.
- <sup>66</sup> Teach me good judgment and knowledge, for I believe in your commandments.
- <sup>67</sup> Before I was humbled I went astray, but now I keep your word.
- <sup>68</sup> You are good and do good; teach me your statutes.
- <sup>69</sup> The arrogant smear me with lies, but with my whole heart I keep your precepts.
- <sup>70</sup> Their hearts are fat and gross,

but I delight in your law.

- 71 It is good for me that I was humbled, so that I might learn your statutes.
- <sup>72</sup> The law of your mouth is better to me than thousands of gold and silver pieces.

## \* WORD: Luke 6:27-38 CEB

<sup>27</sup> "But I say to you who are willing to hear: Love your enemies. Do good to those who hate you. <sup>28</sup> Bless those who curse you. Pray for those who mistreat you. <sup>29</sup> If someone slaps you on the cheek, offer the other one as well. If someone takes your coat, don't withhold your shirt either. <sup>30</sup> Give to everyone who asks and don't demand your things back from those who take them. <sup>31</sup> Treat people in the same way that you want them to treat you.

<sup>32</sup> "If you love those who love you, why should you be commended? Even sinners love those who love them. <sup>33</sup> If you do good to those who do good to you, why should you be commended? Even sinners do that. <sup>34</sup> If you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, why should you

be commended? Even sinners lend to sinners expecting to be paid back in full. <sup>35</sup> Instead, love your enemies, do good, and lend expecting nothing in return. If you do, you will have a great reward. You will be acting the way children of the Most High act, for he is kind to ungrateful and wicked people. <sup>36</sup> Be compassionate just as your Father is compassionate.

<sup>37</sup> "Don't judge, and you won't be judged. Don't condemn, and you won't be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. <sup>38</sup> Give, and it will be given to you. A good portion—packed down, firmly shaken, and overflowing—will fall into your lap. The portion you give will determine the portion you receive in return."
