⁹ But be on guard and watch yourselves closely so that you don't forget the things your eyes saw and so they never leave your mind as long as you live. Teach them to your children and your grandchildren. ¹⁰ Remember that day when you stood before the LORD your God at Horeb, when the

LORD said to me: "Gather the people to me. I will declare my words to them so that they will learn to fear me every day of their lives on the fertile land, and teach their children to do the same." ¹¹ Then you all came close and stood at the foot of the mountain. The mountain was blazing with fire up to the sky, with darkness, cloud, and thick smoke! ¹² The LORD spoke to you out of the very fire itself. You heard the sound of words, but you didn't see any form. There was only a voice. ¹³ The LORD declared his covenant to you, which he commanded you to do - the Ten Commandments - and wrote them on two stone tablets. ¹⁴ At that time, the LORD commanded me to teach you all the regulations and the case laws that you must keep in the land that you are entering to possess.

* WORD: Luke 14:25-35 CEB

²⁵ Large crowds were traveling with Jesus. Turning to them, he said, ²⁶ "Whoever comes to me and doesn't hate father and mother, spouse and children, and brothers and sisters—yes, even one's own life—cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ Whoever doesn't carry their own cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

²⁸ "If one of you wanted to build a tower, wouldn't you first sit down and calculate the cost, to determine whether you have enough money to complete it? ²⁹ Otherwise, when you have laid the foundation but couldn't finish the tower, all who see it will begin to belittle you. ³⁰ They will say, 'Here's the person who began construction and couldn't complete it!' ³¹ Or what king would go to war against another king without first sitting down to consider whether his ten thousand soldiers could go up against the twenty thousand coming against him? ³² And if he didn't think he could win, he would send a representative to discuss terms of peace while his enemy

was still a long way off. ³³ In the same way, none of you who are unwilling to give up all of your possessions can be my disciple.

³⁴ "Salt is good. But if salt loses its flavor, how will it become salty again? ³⁵ It has no value, neither for the soil nor for the manure pile. People throw it away. Whoever has ears to hear should pay attention."

Conference in 1950 and later the General Secretary of the
Home Mission Department, he was a driven man who was
often quoted as saying "I just cannot do enough."
