³⁶ One of the Pharisees invited Jesus to eat with him. After he entered the Pharisee's home, he took his place at the table. ³⁷ Meanwhile, a woman from the city, a sinner, discovered that Jesus was dining in the Pharisee's house. She brought perfumed oil in a vase made of alabaster. ³⁸ Standing behind him at his feet and crying, she began to wet his feet with her tears. She wiped them with her hair, kissed them, and poured the oil on them. ³⁹ When the Pharisee who had invited Jesus saw what was happening, he said to himself, If this man were a prophet, he would know what kind of woman is touching him. He would know that she is a sinner.

⁴⁰ Jesus replied, "Simon, I have something to say to you." "Teacher, speak," he said.

⁴¹ "A certain lender had two debtors. One owed enough money to pay five hundred people for a day's work. The other owed enough money for fifty. ⁴² When they couldn't pay, the lender forgave the debts of them both. Which of them will love him more?"

* COMMEMORATION: Thomas Coke

Thomas Coke was born in Wales in 1747 and educated at Oxford where he received B.A., M.A., and Doctor of Civil Law degrees. An ordained Anglican priest, he was forced by disgruntled parishioners to leave his parish because of his Methodist sympathies. From 1777 through

1784 he served as John Wesley's secretary, confidant, and legal advisor.

The always-ambitious Coke wrote to Wesley pleading for his personal backing and the authority to ordain others for America, saying, "I may want all the influence, in America, which you can throw into my scale." [clx] Wesley then appointed Coke as the first superintendent of the Methodists in America. On December 24, 1784 in Baltimore, "Dr. Coke" (as he was called in America) convened the Christmas Conference, a gathering of Methodist preachers who officially organized the Methodist Episcopal Church in America. He and Asbury became its first bishops. Coke was consistently and adamantly opposed to slavery, and in 1785 he and Asbury visited George Washington to present an antislavery petition. They met with Washington again in 1789 to congratulate him upon his election to the presidency.

But the courtly and well-educated Coke was not always enthusiastically received as a leader among American Methodists. His ties with British Methodism and mission work meant that he was more frequently abroad than in America. In 1786 he became caught up in a conflict over Wesley's authority in America. The 1808 General Conference ended Coke's official relationship with American

Methodism by declaring that he was a resident of Europe and rescinding his authority as superintendent.

Coke continued in his missionary work. Crossing the Atlantic eighteen times, he was involved in Methodist expansion in England, Ireland, the United States, Nova Scotia, and the West Indies and gave away his personal fortune in support of these missionary endeavors. He died while traveling to Ceylon and was buried in the Indian Ocean.
