* WORD: Wisdom 19:1-8,18-22 CEB

¹ but anger without mercy assaulted the ungodly right up to the very end. God knew before they did what was yet to come: how, ² after agreeing to send your people away, and in fact sending them away in haste, their enemies would change their minds and pursue them. ³ And so, even as they still held in their arms those whom they mourned and even as they still raised up their laments at the graves of their dead, another thoughtless plan occurred to them. They decided to pursue those who had fled even after they had agreed to their request to send them away. ⁴ A fate they fully deserved drew them to this

inevitable decision and made them forget about all the things that had so recently happened to them. All this took place so that they might complete the one punishment lacking in their sufferings.

⁵ So at the same time as your people began an incredible journey, their enemies found a strange death. ⁶ The whole creation began to take on a new shape in its very nature. It once again submitted to your commands so that your children might be kept unharmed. ⁷ A cloud appeared, casting its shadow over their camp. Dry land appeared where before there had been only water. It presented them an open path through the Red Sea, ^[a] a grassy plain where before there had been only violent surf. ⁸ Those who were protected by your hand passed through as a single nation, seeing amazing wonders.

¹⁸ If we are careful to observe events, we can see just how the elements of the universe are transformed. It's the same transformation that happens when someone changes the sounds that a harp makes by changing the key while continuing to play the same melody. ¹⁹ In this way, land animals were changed into underwater creatures, while animals that swam in the waters now moved onto the land. ²⁰ Fire was able to burn on the open

water, while water forgot that it was supposed to put fire out. ²¹ Flames no longer burned the exposed flesh of living beings, who were able to walk through the flames. Flames didn't even melt the frostlike crystals that were a kind of food of everlasting life.

²² In every way, Lord, you have made your people great and given them great honor. You never neglected them, but you stood by them in every time and place.

* WORD: Luke 9:1-17 CEB

Jesus called the Twelve together and he gave them power and authority over all demons and to heal sicknesses. ² He sent them out to proclaim God's kingdom and to heal the sick. ³ He told them, "Take nothing for the journey—no walking stick, no bag, no bread, no money, not even an extra shirt. ⁴ Whatever house you enter, remain there until you leave that place. ⁵ Wherever they don't welcome you, as you leave that city, shake the dust off your feet as a witness against them." ⁶ They departed and went through the villages proclaiming the good news and healing people everywhere.

⁷ Herod the ruler heard about everything that was happening. He was confused because some people were saying that John had been raised from the dead, ⁸ others that Elijah had appeared, and still others that one of the ancient prophets had come back to life. ⁹ Herod said, "I beheaded John, so now who am I hearing about?" Herod wanted to see him.

¹⁰ When the apostles returned, they described for Jesus what they had done. Taking them with him, Jesus withdrew privately to a city called Bethsaida. ¹¹ When the crowds figured it out, they followed him. He welcomed

them, spoke to them about God's kingdom, and healed those who were sick.

¹² When the day was almost over, the Twelve came to him and said, "Send the crowd away so that they can go to the nearby villages and countryside and find lodging and food, because we are in a deserted place."

¹³ He replied, "You give them something to eat."

But they said, "We have no more than five loaves of bread and two fish—unless we go and buy food for all these people." ¹⁴ (They said this because about five thousand men were present.)

Jesus said to his disciples, "Seat them in groups of about fifty." ¹⁵ They did so, and everyone was seated. ¹⁶ He took the five loaves and the two fish, looked up to heaven, blessed them, and broke them and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. ¹⁷ Everyone ate until they were full, and the disciples filled twelve baskets with the leftovers.

* COMMEMORATION: JULIAN OF NORWICH

Julian lived as an anchoress in a cell of the parish Church of St. Julian in Norwich, England. Little is known of her life other than what she tells us in her writings and what Margery Kempe reports of meeting with her. Julian's remarkable work, Showings (or Revelations of Divine Love), is the first book known to have been authored by a woman in English. She wrote the "Short Text" directly after sixteen visions visited upon her on May 13, 1373. The "Long Text," written twenty years later, consists of Julian's reflections on the meanings of the revelations. Living at a time of multiple disasters in the world (bubonic plague, frequent famine, and the Hundred Years' War), Julian saw vivid images of Christ's passion, convincing

her how much Christ loved her. She then wrote of God as "Creator ... protector ... lover."
