* WORD: 1 Samuel 10:17-27 CEV

¹⁷ Samuel sent messengers to tell the Israelites to come to Mizpah and meet with the LORD. ¹⁸ When everyone had arrived, Samuel said: The LORD God of Israel told me to remind you that he had rescued you from the Egyptians and from the other nations that abused you.

¹⁹ God has rescued you from your troubles and hard times. But you have rejected your God and have asked for a king. Now each tribe and clan must come near the place of worship so the LORD can choose a king.

²⁰ Samuel brought each tribe, one after the other, to the altar, and the LORD chose the Benjamin tribe. ²¹ Next, Samuel brought each clan of Benjamin there, and the LORD chose the Matri clan. Finally, Saul the son of Kish was chosen. But when they looked for him, he was nowhere to be found.

²² The people prayed, "Our LORD, is Saul here?"

"Yes," the LORD answered, "he is hiding behind the baggage."

²³ The people ran and got Saul and brought him into the middle of the crowd. He was more than a head taller than anyone else. ²⁴ "Look closely at the man the LORD has chosen!" Samuel told the crowd. "There is no one like him!"

The crowd shouted, "Long live the king!"

²⁵ Samuel explained the rights and duties of a king and wrote them all in a book. He put the book in a temple building at

one of the places where the LORD was worshiped. Then Samuel sent everyone home.

²⁶ God had encouraged some young men to become
followers of Saul, and when he returned to his hometown of
Gibeah, they went with him. ²⁷ But some worthless fools said,
"How can someone like Saul rescue us from our enemies?"
They did not want Saul to be their king, and so they didn't
bring him any gifts. But Saul kept calm.

* WORD: Luke 22:52-62 CEV

⁵² Jesus spoke to the chief priests, the temple police, and the leaders who had come to arrest him. He said, "Why do you come out with swords and clubs and treat me like a criminal?
⁵³ I was with you every day in the temple, and you didn't arrest me. But this is your time, and darkness is in control."

⁵⁴ Jesus was arrested and led away to the house of the high priest, while Peter followed at a distance. ⁵⁵ Some people built a fire in the middle of the courtyard and were sitting around it. Peter sat there with them, ⁵⁶ and a servant girl saw him. Then after she had looked at him carefully, she said, "This man was with Jesus!" ⁵⁷ Peter said, "Woman, I don't even know that man!"

⁵⁸ A little later someone else saw Peter and said, "You are one of them!"

"No, I'm not!" Peter replied.

⁵⁹ About an hour later another man insisted, "This man must have been with Jesus. They both come from Galilee."

⁶⁰ Peter replied, "I don't know what you are talking about!" Right then, while Peter was still speaking, a rooster crowed.

⁶¹ The Lord turned and looked at Peter. And Peter remembered that the Lord had said, "Before a rooster crows tomorrow morning, you will say three times that you don't know me." ⁶² Then Peter went out and cried hard.

*** CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH**

* COMMEMORATION: Irenaeus

Irenaeus was truly a "lover of peace," according to the words of a letter with which his fellow Christians in Gaul sent him to Eleutherius, Bishop of Rome, 177. At the time a presbyter in the city of Lyons, Irenaeus was, like many Christians there, concerned about the strained relations between Eleutherius and the Montanist party in their native land. Unlike many of those Christians in Lyons, however, Irenaeus was spared martyrdom in a fierce persecution that arose there while he was away on his diplomatic mission. With the city's bishop among those who had died for the faith, Irenaeus assumed the episcopacy upon returning from Rome. A decade later Irenaeus successfully brought peace between Rome and another group of Asiatic Christians, the Quatrodecimans.
