* 1st READING: 1 Samuel 8:1-22 CEV

1-2 Samuel had two sons. The older one was Joel, and the younger one was Abijah. When Samuel was getting old, he let them be leaders at Beersheba. ³ But they were not like their father. They were dishonest and accepted bribes to give unfair decisions.

⁴One day the nation's leaders came to Samuel at Ramah ⁵ and said, "You are an old man. You set a good example for your sons, but they haven't followed it. Now we want a king to be our leader, just like all the other nations.

Choose one for us!"

⁶ Samuel was upset to hear the leaders say they wanted a king, so he prayed about it. ⁷ The LORD answered:

Samuel, do everything they want you to do. I am really the one they have rejected as their king. 8 Ever since the day I rescued my people from Egypt, they have turned from me to worship idols. Now they are turning away from you.

⁹ Do everything they ask, but warn them and tell them how a king will treat them.

¹⁰ Samuel told the people who were asking for a king what the LORD had said:

¹¹ If you have a king, this is how he will treat you. He will force your sons to join his army. Some of them will ride in his chariots, some will serve in the cavalry, and others will run ahead of his own chariot. 12 Some of them will be officers in charge of a thousand soldiers, and others will be in charge of fifty. Still others will have to farm the king's land and harvest his crops, or make weapons and parts for his chariots. ¹³ Your daughters will have to make perfume or do his cooking and baking.

¹⁴ The king will take your best fields, as well as your vineyards, and olive orchards and give them to his own officials. 15 He will also take a tenth of your grain and grapes and give it to his officers and officials.

¹⁶ The king will take your slaves and your best young men and your donkeys and make them do his work. ¹⁷ He will also take a tenth of your sheep and goats. You will become the king's slaves, ¹⁸ and you will finally cry out for the LORD to save you from the king you wanted. But the LORD won't answer your prayers.

¹⁹⁻²⁰ The people would not listen to Samuel. "No!" they said. "We want to be like other nations. We want a king to rule us and lead us in battle."

²¹ Samuel listened to them and then told the LORD exactly what they had said. ²² "Do what they want," the LORD answered. "Give them a king."

Samuel told the people to go back to their homes.

- ¹⁶ When he summoned famine against the land, and broke every staff of bread,

- ¹⁸ His feet were hurt with fetters, his neck was put in a collar of iron;
- ¹⁹ until what he had said came to pass, the word of the LORD kept testing him.
- ²⁰ The king sent and released him; the ruler of the peoples set him free.
- ²¹ He made him lord of his house, and ruler of all his possessions,
- ²² to instruct his officials at his pleasure, and to teach his elders wisdom.

The most important one of you should be like the least important, and your leader should be like a servant. ²⁷ Who do people think is the greatest, a person who is served or one who serves? Isn't it the one who is served? But I have been with you as a servant.

²⁸ You have stayed with me in all my troubles. ²⁹ So I will give you the right to rule as kings, just as my Father has given me the right to rule as a king. ³⁰ You will eat and drink with me in my kingdom, and you will each sit on a throne to judge the twelve tribes of Israel.

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

* COMMEMORATION:

The Nativity of John the Baptist

The feast of the nativity of John the Baptist is an irregularity in the liturgical calendar because we commemorate John's birth day rather than the day of his death (the only other exceptions being Christ and Mary). Six months in advance of the birth of Jesus, we remember the birth of the baby that leapt in the womb of Elizabeth at the approach of the newly pregnant Mary.

We honor the story of John's nativity because of its importance in the opening of the Gospel of Luke. There John's birth to Elizabeth and Zechariah is portrayed not only as God's blessing to a childless, elderly couple but also as the start of God's plan of salvation through Christ.
