* 1st READING: 1 Samuel 22:1-23 NRSV

David left there and escaped to the cave of Adullam; when his brothers and all his father's house heard of it, they went down there to him. ² Everyone who was in distress, and everyone who was in debt, and everyone who was discontented gathered to him; and he became captain over them. Those who were with him numbered about four hundred.

³ David went from there to Mizpeh of Moab. He said to the king of Moab, "Please let my father and mother come to you, until I know what God will do for me." ⁴ He left them with the king of Moab, and they stayed with him all the time that David was in the stronghold. ⁵ Then the prophet Gad said to David, "Do not remain in the stronghold; leave, and go into the land of Judah." So David left, and went into the forest of Hereth.

⁶ Saul heard that David and those who were with him had been located. Saul was sitting at Gibeah, under the tamarisk tree on the height, with his spear in his hand, and all his servants were standing around him. ⁷ Saul said to his servants who stood around him, "Hear now, you Benjaminites; will the son of Jesse give every one of you fields and vineyards, will he make you all commanders of thousands and commanders of hundreds? ⁸ Is that why all of you have conspired against me? No one discloses to me when my son makes a league with the son of Jesse, none of you is sorry for me or discloses to me that my son has stirred up my servant against me, to lie in wait, as he is doing today." ⁹ Doeg the Edomite, who was in charge of Saul's servants, answered, "I saw the son of Jesse coming to Nob, to Ahimelech son of Ahitub; ¹⁰ he inquired of the LORD for him, gave him provisions, and gave him the sword of Goliath the Philistine."

¹¹ The king sent for the priest Ahimelech son of Ahitub and for all his father's house, the priests who were at Nob; and all of them came to the king. ¹² Saul said, "Listen now, son of Ahitub." He answered, "Here I am, my lord." ¹³ Saul said to him, "Why have you conspired against me, you and the son of Jesse, by giving him bread and a sword, and by inquiring of God for him, so that he has risen against me, to lie in wait, as he is doing today?"

¹⁴ Then Ahimelech answered the king, "Who among all your servants is so faithful as David? He is the king's sonin-law, and is quick to do your bidding, and is honored in your house. ¹⁵ Is today the first time that I have inquired of God for him? By no means! Do not let the king impute

anything to his servant or to any member of my father's house; for your servant has known nothing of all this, much or little." ¹⁶ The king said, "You shall surely die, Ahimelech, you and all your father's house." ¹⁷ The king said to the guard who stood around him, "Turn and kill the priests of the LORD, because their hand also is with David; they knew that he fled, and did not disclose it to me." But the servants of the king would not raise their hand to attack the priests of the LORD. ¹⁸ Then the king said to Doeg, "You, Doeg, turn and attack the priests; on that day he killed eighty-five who wore the linen ephod. ¹⁹ Nob, the city of the priests, he put to the sword; men and women, children and infants, oxen, donkeys, and sheep, he put to the sword.

²⁰ But one of the sons of Ahimelech son of Ahitub, named Abiathar, escaped and fled after David. ²¹ Abiathar told David that Saul had killed the priests of the LORD. ²² David said to Abiathar, "I knew on that day, when Doeg the Edomite was there, that he would surely tell Saul. I am responsible for the lives of all your father's house. ²³ Stay with me, and do not be afraid; for the one who seeks my life seeks your life; you will be safe with me." Holy wisdom, holy word. Thanks be to God!

* WORD: Mark 3:19b-35 NRSV

Then he went home; ²⁰ and the crowd came together again, so that they could not even eat. ²¹ When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, "He has gone out of his mind." ²² And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons." ²³ And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? ²⁴ If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵ And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. ²⁶ And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. ²⁷ But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered.

²⁸ "Truly I tell you, people will be forgiven for their sins and whatever blasphemies they utter; ²⁹ but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit can never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin"— ³⁰ for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit."

³¹ Then his mother and his brothers came; and standing outside, they sent to him and called him. ³² A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you."
³³ And he replied, "Who are my mother and my brothers?"
³⁴ And looking at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! ³⁵ Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

* COMMEMORATION: John Coltrane (1967)

John William Coltrane, grandson to two African Methodist Episcopal Zion ministers and son to amateur musician parents, was born in North Carolina on September 23, 1926. He began his musical explorations on the clarinet in a church-sponsored community band, soon moving to the alto saxophone. After high school, Coltrane continued his musical education in Philadelphia, studying at schools of music and playing in the Navy Band. Following his military service, Coltrane began to play tenor sax for bandleaders including Sonny Rollins, Jimmy Heath, Dizzy Gillespie, and Miles Davis. Increasingly, however, his growing addiction to drugs and alcohol interfered with his music and one after another, these bandleaders let Coltrane go.

By May of 1957, now married and living in New York, Coltrane felt called to change his ways. With the support of his family, he ended his abuse of narcotics and alcohol. As he described this change in the liner notes to his musical and religious manifesto <u>A Love Supreme</u>, "I experienced, by the grace of God, a spiritual awakening which was to lead me to a richer, fuller, more productive life. At that time, in gratitude, I humbly asked to be given the means and privilege to make others happy through

music. I feel this has been granted through His grace. ALL PRAISE TO GOD."
