Now these are the last words of David:

The oracle of David, son of Jesse, the oracle of the man whom God exalted,

the anointed of the God of Jacob,
the favorite of the Strong One of Israel:

- ² The spirit of the LORD speaks through me, his word is upon my tongue.
- ³ The God of Israel has spoken, the Rock of Israel has said to me:

One who rules over people justly, ruling in the fear of God,

- ⁴ is like the light of morning, like the sun rising on a cloudless morning, gleaming from the rain on the grassy land.
- ⁵ Is not my house like this with God?
 For he has made with me an everlasting covenant, ordered in all things and secure.

Will he not cause to prosper all my help and my desire?

⁷ to touch them one uses an iron bar

- ⁶ But the godless are all like thorns that are thrown away; for they cannot be picked up with the hand;
- or the shaft of a spear.

 And they are entirely consumed in fire on the spot.
- ¹³ Towards the beginning of harvest three of the thirty chiefs went down to join David at the cave of Adullam,

while a band of Philistines was encamped in the valley of Rephaim. ¹⁴ David was then in the stronghold; and the garrison of the Philistines was then at Bethlehem. ¹⁵ David said longingly, "O that someone would give me water to drink from the well of Bethlehem that is by the gate!" ¹⁶ Then the three warriors broke through the camp of the Philistines, drew water from the well of Bethlehem that was by the gate, and brought it to David. But he would not drink of it; he poured it out to the LORD, ¹⁷ for he said, "The LORD forbid that I should do this. Can I drink the blood of the men who went at the risk of their lives?" Therefore he would not drink it. The three warriors did these things.

* WORD: Mark 13:1-13 NRSV

13 As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!" ² Then Jesus asked him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down."

³ When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, ⁴ "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?" ⁵ Then Jesus began to say to them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. ⁶ Many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray. ⁷ When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. ⁸ For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs.

⁹ "As for yourselves, beware; for they will hand you over to councils; and you will be beaten in synagogues; and you

will stand before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them. ¹⁰ And the good news must first be proclaimed to all nations. ¹¹ When they bring you to trial and hand you over, do not worry beforehand about what you are to say; but say whatever is given you at that time, for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit. ¹² Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death; ¹³ and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved.

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

Harkness was a systematic theologian and a product of the Social Gospel of the 1920's and early 1930's. She was the first woman to teach in a mainline Protestant seminary in the United States. She combined her early training in philosophy with a spirituality nurtured by prayer, poetry, hymns, and devotional writings.
