* 1st READING: 2 Samuel 19:1-23 NRSV

It was told Joab, "The king is weeping and mourning for Absalom." ² So the victory that day was turned into mourning for all the troops; for the troops heard that day, "The king is grieving for his son." ³ The troops stole into the city that day as soldiers steal in who are ashamed when they flee in battle. ⁴ The king covered his face, and the king cried with a loud voice, "O my son Absalom, O Absalom, my son, my son!" ⁵ Then Joab came into the house to the king, and said, "Today you have covered with shame the faces of all your officers who have saved your life today, and the lives of your sons and your daughters, and the lives of your wives and your concubines, ⁶ for love of those who hate you and for hatred of those who love you. You have made it clear today that commanders and officers are nothing to you; for I perceive that if Absalom were alive and all of us were dead today, then you would be pleased. ⁷ So go out at once and speak kindly to your servants; for I swear by the LORD, if you do not go, not a man will stay with you this night; and this will be worse for you than any disaster that has come upon you from your youth until now." ⁸ Then the king got up and took his seat in the gate. The troops were

all told, "See, the king is sitting in the gate"; and all the troops came before the king.

Meanwhile, all the Israelites had fled to their homes. ⁹ All the people were disputing throughout all the tribes of Israel, saying, "The king delivered us from the hand of our enemies, and saved us from the hand of the Philistines; and now he has fled out of the land because of Absalom. ¹⁰ But Absalom, whom we anointed over us, is dead in battle. Now therefore why do you say nothing about bringing the king back?"

¹¹ King David sent this message to the priests Zadok and Abiathar, "Say to the elders of Judah, 'Why should you be the last to bring the king back to his house? The talk of all Israel has come to the king. ¹² You are my kin, you are my bone and my flesh; why then should you be the last to bring back the king?' ¹³ And say to Amasa, 'Are you not my bone and my flesh? So may God do to me, and more, if you are not the commander of my army from now on, in place of Joab.'" ¹⁴ Amasa swayed the hearts of all the people of Judah as one, and they sent word to the king, "Return, both you and all your servants." ¹⁵ So the king came back to the Jordan; and Judah came to Gilgal to meet the king and to bring him over the Jordan.

¹⁶ Shimei son of Gera, the Benjaminite, from Bahurim, hurried to come down with the people of Judah to meet King David; ¹⁷ with him were a thousand people from Benjamin. And Ziba, the servant of the house of Saul, with his fifteen sons and his twenty servants, rushed down to the Jordan ahead of the king, ¹⁸ while the crossing was taking place, to bring over the king's household, and to do his pleasure.

Shimei son of Gera fell down before the king, as he was about to cross the Jordan, ¹⁹ and said to the king, "May my lord not hold me guilty or remember how your servant did wrong on the day my lord the king left Jerusalem; may the king not bear it in mind. ²⁰ For your servant knows that I have sinned; therefore, see, I have come this day, the first of all the house of Joseph to come down to meet my lord the king." ²¹ Abishai son of Zeruiah answered, "Shall not Shimei be put to death for this, because he cursed the LORD's anointed?" ²² But David said, "What have I to do with you, you sons of Zeruiah, that you should today become an adversary to me? Shall anyone be put to death in Israel this day? For do I not know that I am this day king over Israel?" ²³ The king said to Shimei, "You shall not die." And the king gave him his oath.

- O LORD, remember in David's favor all the hardships he endured;

 a dwelling place for the Mighty One of Jacob."

* 2nd READING: Mark 12:28-34 NRSV

²⁸ One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?"
²⁹ Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; ³⁰ you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is

no other commandment greater than these." ³² Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he is one, and besides him there is no other'; ³³ and 'to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength,' and 'to love one's neighbor as oneself,'—this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." ³⁴ When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." After that no one dared to ask him any question.

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*. **This is what your holy** <u>prophets</u> **an-nounced: deliverance from enemies**

* COMMEMORATION: Jonathan Myrick Daniels (1965)

Despite his New England childhood, Jonathan Myrick Daniels grew up with a romantic fondness for the South, inflamed by brief stays in Arkansas and Kentucky and an undergraduate education in Virginia. Bright and sensitive, Daniels thrived at the Episcopal Theological School in Cambridge until the spring of his second year, when Martin Luther King, Jr., summoned religious leaders to join him in the march from Selma to Montgomery. With ten other students, Daniels traveled to Alabama to practice the love and justice of the gospel in support of civil rights. Unlike most of his fellows, Daniels remained in Selma after the march, finding self-identity in his work there. He returned to Selma, after receiving permission from his seminary professors, with student Judy Upham. The two joined in protests, worked to integrate the town's Episcopal Church, and assisted Selma's African-American residents in accessing social services.

While on his third trip to Alabama, Daniels turned his attention to Lowndes County, a poor and violently segregated rural area near Selma. On August 14, he joined a protest of segregated businesses in Lowndes, only to be quickly arrested. The group was held, illegally, in the county jail and suddenly released several days

later. Spurred by fear of the released protestors, a local highway official threatened Daniels and his interracial company as they attempted to enter a store. The man shot Daniels, who had pushed fellow protestor Ruby Sales out of the way. Another member of the group was injured, but Daniels was killed instantly.

Reflecting on his work in Selma for a seminary assignment, Daniels wrote:

Sometimes we take to the streets, sometimes we yawn through interminable meetings. Sometimes we talk with white men in their homes and offices, sometimes we sit out a murderous night with an alcoholic and his family because we love them and cannot stand apart. Sometimes we love them and cannot stand apart. Sometimes we confront the posse, and sometimes we hold a child. Sometimes we stand with men who have learned to hate, and sometimes we must stand a little apart from them... For through the bramble bush of doubt and fear and supposed success we are groping our way to the realization that above all else, we are called to be saints... Selma, Alabama, is like all the world: it needs the life and witness of militant saints. On this day, the eve of his death, we remember Jonathan Daniels and draw inspiration from his courageous stance of humble love.
