Then after a little while the bystanders again said to Peter, "Certainly you are one of them; for you are a Galilean." ⁷¹ But he began to curse, and he swore an oath, "I do not know this man you are talking about." ⁷² At that moment the cock crowed for the second time. Then Peter remembered that Jesus had said to him, "Before the cock crows twice, you will deny me three times." And he broke down and wept.

* **COMMEMORATION**: John Bunyan (1688)

A puritan preacher and writer, Bunyan is best remembered for The Pilgrim's Progress, an extended allegory about the Christian pilgrimage.

Born into an Anglican family in 1628, Bunyan experienced a dramatic conversion when he married Margaret Bentley, a member of a Puritan sect, in 1648. Starting shortly after his conversion and continuing to the end of his life, he engaged in a ministry of preaching, teaching, and writing. After the restoration of the monarchy in 1660 following the English Civil War, his activities as a lay preacher landed him in jail on more than one occasion. During an early imprisonment he wrote his famous spiritual autobiography, Grace Abounding to the Chief of Sinners. Most scholars agree that much, if not most, of Pilgrim's Progress was also composed while he was in jail.
