* 1ST READING: Hebrews 12:3-11 CEB

³ Think about the one who endured such opposition from sinners so that you won't be discouraged and you won't give up. ⁴ In your struggle against sin, you haven't resisted yet to the point of shedding blood, ⁵ and you have forgotten the encouragement that addresses you as sons and daughters:

- My child, don't make light of the Lord's discipline
 - or give up when you are corrected by him,
- ⁶ because the Lord disciplines whomever he loves,

and he punishes every son or daughter whom he accepts.

⁷ Bear hardship for the sake of discipline. God is treating you like sons and daughters! What child isn't disciplined by his or her father? ⁸ But if you don't experience discipline, which happens to all children, then you are illegitimate and not real sons and daughters. ⁹ What's more, we had human parents who disciplined us, and we respected them for it. How much more should we submit to the Father of spirits and live? ¹⁰ Our human parents disciplined us for a little while, as it seemed best to them, but God does it for our benefit so that we can share his holiness. ¹¹ No discipline is fun while it lasts, but it seems painful at the time. Later, however, it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness for those who have been trained by it.

* GOSPEL READING: John 7:1-13 CEB

After this Jesus traveled throughout Galilee. He didn't want to travel in Judea, because the Jewish authorities wanted to kill him. ² When it was almost time for the Jewish Festival of Booths, ³ Jesus' brothers said to him, "Leave Galilee. Go to Judea so that your disciples can see the amazing works that you do. ⁴ Those who want to be known publicly don't do things secretly. Since you can do these things, show yourself to the world." ⁵ His brothers said this because even they didn't believe in him.

⁶ Jesus replied, "For you, anytime is fine. But my time hasn't come yet. ⁷ The world can't hate you. It hates me, though, because I testify that its works are evil. ⁸ You go up to the festival. I'm not going to this one because my time hasn't yet come." ⁹ Having said this, he stayed in Galilee. ¹⁰ However, after his brothers left for the festival, he went too—not openly but in secret.

¹¹ The Jewish leaders were looking for Jesus at the festival. They kept asking, "Where is he?" ¹² The crowds were murmuring about him. "He's a good man," some said, but others were saying, "No, he tricks the people." ¹³ No one spoke about him publicly, though, for fear of the Jewish authorities.

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, God of Israel, for you come to visit us and ransom us from bondage. You have brought forth a strong De-liverer in the house of your child David. This is what your holy prophets an-nounced: deliverance from enemies and from the hand of all who hate us; mercy a-mong our ancestors, and remembrance of your ho-ly covenant. This is the promise you swore to our an-cestor, Abraham, to make us un-a-fraid, to rescue us from our enemies, to serve before you, holy and just, all the days of our lives. And this, my little child, shall be called prophet of the Most High, going before you, Adonai, to pre-pare your paths, making your people know de-liverance by the forgiveness of their sins. Through your merciful compassions, God our God, the dawn from on high shall visit us,

to shine on those kept in dungeons and the <u>shadows</u> of *death* and to guide our feet onto the <u>path</u> of *peace*. LUKE 1:68-79 Glory to you, O Trinity, most <u>holy</u> and *blessed*, one God, now and for-ever, A-*men*.

* THE APOSTLE'S CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father Almighty. * COMMEMORATION: Cornelius the Centurion

All that we know of Cornelius is contained in the Book of Acts (chapters 10 and 11). A centurion was a Roman army officer, theoretically in charge of a hundred men. Several centurions are mentioned in the New Testament . . . and they are consistently portrayed favorably.

Cornelius was the first Gentile converted to Christianity, along with his household, and Luke, recording this event, clearly regards it as an event of the utmost importance in the history of the early Church, the beginning of the Church's decision to admit Gentiles to full and equal fellowship with Jewish Christians. Cornelius lived in Caesarea, the political capital of Judea under Herod and the Romans. Although he is not mentioned again, he and his household presumably formed the nucleus of the Christian community that we find mentioned later (Acts 8:40; 21:18) in this important city.
