* 1ST READING: Hebrews 3:12-19 CEB

¹² Watch out, brothers and sisters, so that none of you have an evil, unfaithful heart that abandons the living God.

¹³ Instead, encourage each other every day, as long as it's called "today," so that none of you become insensitive to God because of sin's deception. ¹⁴ We are partners with Christ, but only if we hold on to the confidence we had in the beginning until the end.

¹⁵ When it says,

Today, if you hear his voice, don't have stubborn hearts as they did in the rebellion.

¹⁶ Who was it who rebelled when they heard his voice? Wasn't it all of those who were brought out of Egypt by Moses? ¹⁷ And with whom was God angry for forty years? Wasn't it with the ones who sinned, whose bodies fell in the desert? ¹⁸ And against whom did he swear that they would never enter his rest, if not against the ones who were disobedient? ¹⁹ We see that they couldn't enter because of their lack of faith.

* GOSPEL READING John 2:1-12 CEB

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee.

Jesus' mother was there, and ² Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the celebration. ³ When the wine ran out,

Jesus' mother said to him, "They don't have any wine."

⁴ Jesus replied, "Woman, what does that have to do with me? My time hasn't come yet."

⁵ His mother told the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

⁶ Nearby were six stone water jars used for the Jewish cleansing ritual, each able to hold about twenty or thirty gallons.

⁷ Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water," and they filled them to the brim. ⁸ Then he told them, "Now draw some from them and take it to the headwaiter," and they did. ⁹ The headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine. He didn't know where it came from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew.

The headwaiter called the groom ¹⁰ and said, "Everyone serves the good wine first. They bring out the second-rate wine only when the guests are drinking freely. You kept the good wine until now." ¹¹ This was the first miraculous sign that Jesus did in Cana of Galilee. He revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him.

¹² After this, Jesus and his mother, his brothers, and his disciples went down to Capernaum and stayed there for a few days.
