* 1st READING: Hebrews 3:1-11 CEB

Therefore, brothers and sisters who are partners in the heavenly calling, think about Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession. ² Jesus was faithful to the one

who appointed him just like Moses was faithful in God's house. ³ But he deserves greater glory than Moses in the same way that the builder of the house deserves more honor than the house itself. ⁴ Every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything. ⁵ Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant in order to affirm the things that would be spoken later. ⁶ But Jesus was faithful over God's house as a Son. We are his house if we hold on to the confidence and the pride that our hope gives us.

⁷ So, as the Holy Spirit says,

Today, if you hear his voice,

- don't have stubborn hearts as they did in the rebellion, on the day when they tested me in the desert.
- ⁹ That is where your ancestors challenged and tested me, though they had seen my work for forty years.
- ¹⁰ So I was angry with them.

I said, "Their hearts always go off course, and they don't know my ways."

¹¹ Because of my anger I swore: "They will never enter my rest!" Holy wisdom, holy word.

⁴⁵ Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law and the Prophets: Jesus, Joseph's son, from Nazareth."

⁴⁶ Nathanael responded, "Can anything from Nazareth be good?"

Philip said, "Come and see."

⁴⁷ Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said about him, "Here is a genuine Israelite in whom there is no deceit."

⁴⁸ Nathanael asked him, "How do you know me?"

Jesus answered, "Before Philip called you, I saw you under the fig tree."

⁴⁹ Nathanael replied, "Rabbi, you are God's Son. You are the king of Israel."

* COMMEMORATION: George Fox

"A radical among radicals, George Fox, the founder of the Society of Friends, belongs to the left wing of 17th century Puritanism. Born in 1624, Fox left his village home in Leicestershire at eighteen and began a lifetime of traveling: first, in search of a personal awakening; then, after 1646, to preach the godly life as he now understood it. Fox found enthusiastic hearers among folk disaffected with the political and religious solutions of Cromwellian England. Together with other itinerant preachers, men and women, he established congregations first in the north and midlands, then in the south-west. By 1660, when the monarchy was restored, the "Quakers," as they were nicknamed, seemed a significant enough threat to merit vigorous persecution."
