* 1st READING: Hebrews 11:23-31 CEB

²³ By faith Moses was hidden by his parents for three months when he was born, because they saw that the child was beautiful and they weren't afraid of the king's orders.

²⁴ By faith Moses refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter when he was grown up. ²⁵ He chose to be mistreated with God's people instead of having the temporary pleasures of sin. ²⁶ He thought that the abuses he suffered for Christ were more valuable than the treasures of Egypt, since he was looking forward to the reward.

⁵² Then the Jews debated among themselves, asking, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

* COMMEMORATION: TIMOTHY and TITUS

Timothy and Titus provided spiritual and intellectual support for the southern European mission of the Gospel.

Communications preserved in the Pastoral Epistles, Paul's Letters, and the Church's story in Acts give us a glimpse into their contributions to the early Church.

The early Christian community at Lystra commended Eunice's son, Timothy, to Christian service with Paul. Young Timothy underwent circumcision in deference to his Jewish mother and the Jewish communities in which he would minister (Acts 16: 3). Undergoing ordination by laying on of hands (1 Tim 1: 18; 4: 17; 2 Tim 1: 6), he joined Paul for his second and third missionary journeys. As Paul's associate, Timothy's work was crucial in founding churches in Corinth, Thessalonica, and Philippi. He was sometimes sent to deal with particularly sensitive and difficult situations.

As circumcision figured in Timothy's nascent ministry, so it did with Titus as well. The decision that Titus would not undergo circumcision proved a major departure of Christianity from its Jewish roots (Gal 2: 1-3). Titus' ministry would touch the lives of the poor and the outcast, eminently seen in his work to collect the contribution for the struggling church in Jerusalem (2 Cor 8: 16-17).
