* 1ST READING: Philemon 1-25 CEB

¹ From Paul, who is a prisoner for the cause of Christ Jesus, and our brother Timothy.

To Philemon our dearly loved coworker, ² Apphia our sister, Archippus our fellow soldier, and the church that meets in your house.

³ May the grace and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

⁴ Philemon, I thank my God every time I mention you in my prayers ⁵ because I've heard of your love and faithfulness, which you have both for the Lord Jesus and for all God's people. ⁶ I pray that your partnership in the faith might become effective by an understanding of all that is good among us in Christ. ⁷ I have great joy and encouragement because of your love, since the hearts of God's people are refreshed by your actions, my brother.

⁸ Therefore, though I have enough confidence in Christ to command you to do the right thing, ⁹ I would rather appeal to you through love. I, Paul-an old man, and now also a prisoner for Christ Jesus—¹⁰ appeal to you for my child Onesimus. I became his father in the faith during my time in prison. ¹¹ He was useless to you before, but now he is useful to both of us. ¹² I'm sending him back to you, which is like sending you my own heart. ¹³ I considered keeping him with me so that he might serve me in your place during my time in prison because of the gospel. ¹⁴ However, I didn't want to do anything without your consent so that your act of kindness would occur willingly and not under pressure. ¹⁵ Maybe this is the reason that Onesimus was separated from you for a while so that you might have him back forever—¹⁶ no longer as a slave but more than a slave—that is, as a dearly loved brother. He is especially a dearly loved brother to me. How much more can he become a brother to you, personally and spiritually in the Lord!

¹⁷ So, if you really consider me a partner, welcome Onesimus as if you were welcoming me. ¹⁸ If he has harmed you in any way or owes you money, charge it to my account. ¹⁹ I, Paul, will pay it back to you (I'm writing this with my own hand). Of course, I won't mention that you owe me your life.

²⁰ Yes, brother, I want this favor from you in the Lord!
Refresh my heart in Christ. ²¹ I'm writing to you, confident of your obedience and knowing that you will do more than what I ask. ²² Also, one more thing—prepare a guest room for me.
I hope that I will be released from prison to be with you because of your prayers.

²³ Epaphras, who is in prison with me for the cause of Christ
Jesus, greets you, ²⁴ as well as my coworkers Mark,
Aristarchus, Demas, and Luke.

²⁵ May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit.

Holy wisdom, holy word. Thanks be to God!

* GOSPEL READING: John 12:9-19 CEB

Many Jews learned that he was there. They came not only because of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. ¹⁰ The chief priests decided that they would kill Lazarus too. ¹¹ It was because of Lazarus that many of the Jews had deserted them and come to believe in Jesus.

¹² The next day the great crowd that had come for the festival heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³ They took palm branches and went out to meet him. They shouted,

"Hosanna!

Blessings on the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessings on the king of Israel!"

¹⁴ Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,

¹⁵ Don't be afraid, Daughter Zion.

Look! Your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt.

¹⁶ His disciples didn't understand these things at first. After he was glorified, they remembered that these things had been written about him and that they had done these things to him.

¹⁷ The crowd who had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead were testifying about him. ¹⁸ That's why the crowd came to meet him, because they had heard about this miraculous sign that he had done. ¹⁹ Therefore, the Pharisees said to each other, "See! You've accomplished nothing! Look! The whole world is following him!"

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

* COMMEMORATION: AMANDA BERRY SMITH

Former slave and washerwoman, Amanda Berry Smith achieved international acclaim as a holiness preacher, evangelist, and "singing pilgrim" who traveled throughout the United States, Europe, India, and Africa. Born January 23, 1837, about 20 miles north of Baltimore, she was freed during childhood when her father purchased his family and moved them north to Pennsylvania. Denied an education because of local race prejudice, the Berry children learned the alphabet from their parents. She went to work as a domestic, and while praying in the basement of the home where she worked, was converted to the Christian faith. She remained a lifelong member of the African Methodist Episcopal Church.
