#### \* 1st READING: 1 John 2:1-11 CEB

My little children, I'm writing these things to you so that

you don't sin. But if you do sin, we have an advocate with

the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one. <sup>2</sup>He is God's

way of dealing with our sins, not only ours but the sins of the whole world. <sup>3</sup> This is how we know that we know him: if we keep his commandments. <sup>4</sup> The one who claims, "I know him," while not keeping his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in this person. <sup>5</sup> But the love of God is truly perfected in whoever keeps his word. This is how we know we are in him. <sup>6</sup> The one who claims to remain in him ought to live in the same way as he lived. <sup>7</sup> Dear friends, I'm not writing a new commandment to you, but an old commandment that you had from the beginning. The old commandment is the message you heard. 8 On the other hand, I am writing a new commandment to you, which is true in him and in you, because the darkness is passing away and the true light already shines. <sup>9</sup> The one who claims to be in the light while hating a brother or sister is in the darkness even now. <sup>10</sup> The person loving a brother and sister stays in the light, and there is nothing in the light that causes a person to stumble. <sup>11</sup> But the person who hates a brother or sister

is in the darkness and lives in the darkness, and doesn't know where to go because the darkness blinds the eyes.

#### \* 2nd READING: John 9:18-41 CEB

<sup>18</sup> The Jewish leaders didn't believe the man had been blind and received his sight until they called for his parents. <sup>19</sup> The Jewish leaders asked them, "Is this your son? Are you saying he was born blind? How can he now see?"

<sup>20</sup> His parents answered, "We know he is our son. We know he was born blind. <sup>21</sup> But we don't know how he now sees, and we don't know who healed his eyes. Ask him. He's old enough to speak for himself." <sup>22</sup> His parents said this because they feared the Jewish authorities. This is because the Jewish authorities had already decided that whoever confessed Jesus to be the Christ would be

- expelled from the synagogue. <sup>23</sup> That's why his parents said, "He's old enough. Ask him."
- <sup>24</sup> Therefore, they called a second time for the man who had been born blind and said to him, "Give glory to God. We know this man is a sinner."
- <sup>25</sup> The man answered, "I don't know whether he's a sinner. Here's what I do know: I was blind and now I see."
- <sup>26</sup> They questioned him: "What did he do to you? How did he heal your eyes?"
- <sup>27</sup> He replied, "I already told you, and you didn't listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples too?"
- <sup>28</sup> They insulted him: "You are his disciple, but we are Moses' disciples. <sup>29</sup> We know that God spoke to Moses, but we don't know where this man is from."
- <sup>30</sup> The man answered, "This is incredible! You don't know where he is from, yet he healed my eyes! <sup>31</sup> We know that God doesn't listen to sinners. God listens to anyone who is devout and does God's will. <sup>32</sup> No one has ever heard of a healing of the eyes of someone born blind. <sup>33</sup> If this man wasn't from God, he couldn't do this."

- <sup>34</sup> They responded, "You were born completely in sin! How is it that you dare to teach us?" Then they expelled him.
- <sup>35</sup> Jesus heard they had expelled the man born blind. Finding him, Jesus said, "Do you believe in the Human One?"
- <sup>36</sup> He answered, "Who is he, sir? I want to believe in him."
- <sup>37</sup> Jesus said, "You have seen him. In fact, he is the one speaking with you."
- <sup>38</sup> The man said, "Lord, I believe." And he worshipped Jesus.
- <sup>39</sup> Jesus said, "I have come into the world to exercise judgment so that those who don't see can see and those who see will become blind."
- <sup>40</sup> Some Pharisees who were with him heard what he said and asked, "Surely we aren't blind, are we?"
- <sup>41</sup> Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you wouldn't have any sin, but now that you say, 'We see,' your sin remains.
