* 1ST READING: 1 Corinthians 12:27-13:3 CEB

²⁷ You are the body of Christ and parts of each other. ²⁸ In the church, God has appointed first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, the ability to help others, leadership skills, different kinds of tongues. ²⁹ All aren't apostles, are they? All aren't prophets, are they? All aren't prophets, are they? All aren't perform miracles, do they? ³⁰ All don't have gifts of healing, do they? All don't speak in different tongues, do they? All don't interpret, do they? ³¹ Use your ambition to try to get the greater gifts. And I'm going to show you an even better way.

13 If I speak in tongues of human beings and of angels but I don't have love, I'm a clanging gong or a clashing cymbal. ² If I have the gift of prophecy and I know all the mysteries and everything else, and if I have such complete faith that I can move mountains but I don't have love, I'm nothing. ³ If I give away everything that I have and hand over my own body to feel good about what I've done but I don't have love, I receive no benefit whatsoever.

* GOSPEL READING: Mark 9:2-13 CEB

² Six days later Jesus took Peter, James, and John, and brought them to the top of a very high mountain where they were alone. He was transformed in front of them, ³ and his clothes were amazingly bright, brighter than if they had been bleached white. ⁴ Elijah and Moses appeared and were talking with Jesus. ⁵ Peter reacted to all of this by saying to Jesus, "Rabbi, it's good that we're here. Let's make three shrines—one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."
⁶ He said this because he didn't know how to respond, for the three of them were terrified.

⁷ Then a cloud overshadowed them, and a voice spoke from the cloud, "This is my Son, whom I dearly love. Listen to him!" ⁸ Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.

⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them not to tell anyone what they had seen until after the Human One had risen from the dead. ¹⁰ So they kept it to themselves, wondering, "What's this 'rising from the dead'?" ¹¹ They asked Jesus, "Why do the legal experts say that Elijah must come first?"

¹² He answered, "Elijah does come first to restore all things. Why was it written that the Human One would suffer many things and be rejected? ¹³ In fact, I tell you that Elijah has come, but they did to him whatever they wanted, just as it was written about him."
