* 1st READING: 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 CEB

¹² I have the freedom to do anything, but not everything is helpful. I have the freedom to do anything, but I won't be controlled by anything. ¹³ Food is for the stomach and the stomach is for food, and yet God will do away with both. The body isn't for sexual immorality but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body. ¹⁴ God has raised the Lord and will raise us through his power. ¹⁵ Don't you know that your bodies are parts of Christ? So then, should I take parts of Christ and make them a part of someone who is sleeping around? No way! ¹⁶ Don't you know that anyone who is joined to someone who is sleeping around is one body with that person? The scripture says, *The two will become one flesh*. ¹⁷ The one who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with him. ¹⁸ Avoid sexual immorality! Every sin

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that a person can do is committed outside the body, except those who engage in sexual immorality commit sin against their own bodies. ¹⁹ Or don't you know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you? Don't you know that you have the Holy Spirit from God, and you don't belong to yourselves? ²⁰ You have been bought and paid for, so honor God with your body.

* SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

* 2nd READING: Mark 4:21-34 CEB

²¹ Jesus said to them, "Does anyone bring in a lamp in order to put it under a basket or a bed? Shouldn't it be placed on a lampstand? ²² Everything hidden will be revealed, and everything secret will come out into the open. ²³ Whoever has ears to listen should pay attention!" ²⁴ He said to them, "Listen carefully! God will evaluate you with the same standard you use to evaluate others. Indeed, you will receive even more. ²⁵ Those who have

will receive more, but as for those who don't have, even what they don't have will be taken away from them."

²⁶ Then Jesus said, "This is what God's kingdom is like. It's as though someone scatters seed on the ground, ²⁷ then sleeps and wakes night and day. The seed sprouts and grows, but the farmer doesn't know how. ²⁸ The earth produces crops all by itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full head of grain. ²⁹ Whenever the crop is ready, the farmer goes out to cut the grain because it's harvesttime."

30 He continued, "What's a good image for God's kingdom? What parable can I use to explain it?
31 Consider a mustard seed. When scattered on the ground, it's the smallest of all the seeds on the earth;
32 but when it's planted, it grows and becomes the largest of all vegetable plants. It produces such large branches that the birds in the sky are able to nest in its shade."

³³ With many such parables he continued to give them the word, as much as they were able to hear. ³⁴ He spoke to them only in parables, then explained everything to his disciples when he was alone with them.

* CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH

We bless you, Adonai, <u>God</u> of *Israel*, for you come to visit us and ransom <u>us</u> from *bondage*. You have brought forth a <u>strong</u> De-*liverer* in the house of <u>your</u> child *David*.

* COMMEMORATION: PATRICK

Born during the final years of Roman Britain (c. 390), Patrick enjoyed an upbringing of social privilege. This ended violently. At sixteen, Patrick was seized by Irish raiders on a plundering spree along the west coast of England. He was sold and put to work as a shepherd-slave on Ireland's Atlantic coast. Here, the orphan found his God: "the Lord opened the understanding of my unbelieving heart. [He] protected me . . . and strengthened me as a father comforts his son."

Toward the end of his life, Patrick wrote the autobiographical Confession. It discloses a man of small scholarship but great evangelistic passion and a moving

identification with the Irish people. Such sympathy is an example for all mission. In Ireland, "the outcast" and former slave found home if not rest. Patrick ends his book by referring all achievement to God: he begs that "whosoever deigns to look at . . . this writing which Patrick, a sinner, unlearned, has composed in Ireland" shall conclude that "if I did or showed forth anything however small according to God's good pleasure . . . it was the gift of God."
