## \* SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

#### \* 1st READING: Romans 5:1-11 CEB

Therefore, since we have been made righteous through his faithfulness, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>2</sup> We have access by faith into this grace in which we stand through him, and we boast in the hope of God's glory. <sup>3</sup> But not only that! We even take pride in our problems, because we know that trouble produces endurance, <sup>4</sup> endurance produces character, and character produces hope. <sup>5</sup> This hope doesn't put us to shame, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

<sup>6</sup> While we were still weak, at the right moment, Christ died for ungodly people. <sup>7</sup> It isn't often that someone will die for a righteous person, though maybe someone might dare to die for a good person. <sup>8</sup> But God shows his love for us, because while we were still sinners Christ died for us. <sup>9</sup> So, now that we have been made righteous by his blood, we can be even more certain that we will be saved from God's wrath through him. <sup>10</sup> If we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son while we were still enemies, now that we have been reconciled, how much more certain is it that we will be saved by his life? <sup>11</sup> And not only that: we even take pride in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, the one through whom we now have a restored relationship with God.

\* 2<sup>nd</sup> READING: Matthew 20:17-28 CEB

<sup>17</sup> As Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the Twelve aside by themselves on the road. He told them,

<sup>18</sup> "Look, we are going up to Jerusalem. The Human One will be handed over to the chief priests and legal experts. They will condemn him to death. <sup>19</sup> They will hand him over to the Gentiles to be ridiculed, tortured, and crucified. But he will be raised on the third day."

<sup>20</sup> Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus along with her sons. Bowing before him, she asked a favor of him.

<sup>21</sup> "What do you want?" he asked.

She responded, "Say that these two sons of mine will sit, one on your right hand and one on your left, in your kingdom."

<sup>22</sup> Jesus replied, "You don't know what you're asking! Can you drink from the cup that I'm about to drink from?"
They said to him, "We can."

<sup>23</sup> He said to them, "You will drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left hand isn't mine to give. It belongs to those for whom my Father prepared it."

<sup>24</sup> Now when the other ten disciples heard about this, they became angry with the two brothers. <sup>25</sup> But Jesus called them over and said, "You know that those who rule the Gentiles show off their authority over them and their high-

ranking officials order them around. <sup>26</sup> But that's not the way it will be with you. Whoever wants to be great among you will be your servant. <sup>27</sup> Whoever wants to be first among you will be your slave— <sup>28</sup> just as the Human One didn't come to be served but rather to serve and to give his life to liberate many people."
